The Power to Witness

Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

When we see what Jesus has already done for us:

- We are <u>compelled</u> to be his witnesses and <u>give ourselves</u> to God's mission.
- We are filled with power to be his witnesses.

The power of the Holy Spirit is necessary.

Big Idea: Receive $\underline{\text{power}}$ through the $\underline{\text{Holy Spirit}}$ to be effective witnesses for Christ, and...

• Experience self-denying boldness and joyfulness.

Acts 5:40-42 "[The High Council] called in the apostles and had them flogged. Then they ordered them never again to speak in the name of Jesus, and they let them go. ⁴¹ The apostles left the high council rejoicing that God had counted them worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus. ⁴² And every day, in the Temple and from house to house, they continued to teach and preach this message: "Jesus is the Messiah."

• Experience miraculous <u>healing</u> and <u>restoration</u>.

Acts 3:4-8 Peter and John looked at him intently, and Peter said, "Look at us!" ⁵ The lame man looked at them eagerly, expecting some money. ⁶ But Peter said, "I don't have any silver or gold for you. But I'll give you what I have. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, get up and walk!" ⁷ Then Peter took the lame man by the right hand and helped him up. And as he did, the man's feet and ankles were instantly healed and strengthened. ⁸ He jumped up, stood on his feet, and began to walk! Then, walking, leaping, and praising God, he went into the Temple with them."

- Experience victory over the <u>spiritual forces</u> of darkness. Acts 13:9-12
- Experience sacrificial generosity and unity in the Church. Acts 4:32-34
- Experience unexplainable <u>provision</u> and <u>protection</u>. Acts 28:1-6
- Experience amazing answers to persistent and passionate prayer. Acts 12:6-8
- Experience direction and guidance as we carry out God's mission. Acts 16:6-9
- Experience the transforming power of the Kingdom of Jesus.

Acts 2:42-47 All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer. ⁴³ A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. ⁴⁴ And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. ⁴⁵ They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. ⁴⁶ They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity— ⁴⁷ all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

What can we do right now?

- Witness where God has placed you.
- Pray for workers to be sent out for God's mission.
- Sacrifice to support God's mission.
- Mobilize others for God's mission.
- Go for God's mission.
