Seeing the bigger picture of God's plan and who we are in that plan helps us obey.

Genesis 6:5 "The Lord observed the extent of human wickedness on the earth, and he saw that everything they thought or imagined was consistently and totally evil."

Genesis 6:6 "So the Lord was sorry he had ever made them and put them on the earth. It broke his heart."

Big Idea: See and Submit to God's Bigger Plan to Respond in Obedience.

How do we practically live this out?

- **Don't "miss the boat".** John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father apart from me." (Jesus)

How certain are you that you have an eternal relationship with Jesus?

- **Build the things of God.**

What things is God asking you to build?

- **Live in light of the Coming Kingdom.** Matthew 24:36-39

What priorities do you need to adjust to live in light of the Coming Kingdom?
