Wisdom to be Productive - Jan. 31

- 1. What was most helpful about this message? What questions did this message raise for you?
- 2. Read Proverbs 6:6-11. What lesson does the author want us to learn from the ants?
- 3. Consider your "work" right now (whether you earn an income, or whether you are a stay-at-home parent, student, volunteer, etc).
 - a. Do you tend to view your work as a means to an end, or as an end in itself?
 - b. Do you tend to think about how your work contributes to God's dream for society or do you primarily think about how your work contributes to your life?
 - c. Based on the definition of "calling" from the message, would you say that you are living out your calling?
- 4. Read through the Proverbs listed in the Sequoia Notes for each of the three characteristics of productive workers (diligence, integrity, and Goddependence). Then, for each characteristic discuss the following:
 - a. Do you see this characteristic or its opposite lived out in your place of work (business, school, neighborhood, home, etc)?
 - b. Do you currently find this characteristic challenging to live out? Why or why not?
 - c. Give a practical example of how you could intentionally practice this characteristic in your work this coming week.
- 5. What do you sense God is saying to you about how you view and do your work, and what will you do in response?
- 6. Read Matthew 11:28-30. Jesus promises rest to His followers. But not a complete stop from everything. We still to have a "yoke" to wear--work to do. But Jesus promises that when we do it His way, it will not lead to exhaustion or heavy burden. If you feel weary and carry heavy burdens from your work these days, receive this invitation of Jesus. Go to Him, ask Him to teach you and receive the rest for your soul that He promises.

- 1. How you can contribute to God's **KINGDOM DREAM.** (Matthew 6:10, 33)
- 2. Your CALLING.

Work is to be done WELL.

Colossians 3:17 (NIV) "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men."

Productivity is not simply about getting MORE DONE.

Productivity is about getting the <u>RIGHT THINGS DONE</u> in the <u>RIGHT WAY</u>.

Biblical wisdom for being productive in your work:

Work with <u>DILIGENCE</u>, not <u>LAZINESS</u>.

Work with INTEGRITY, not DISHONESTY.
