Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead? #29 of 33— May 27, 2018

- 1) Take some time to discuss how your IC has been and will live out the Kingdom of Jesus together.
- In what ways have we been living like family recently? How will we live out our family identity in the coming week?
- How have we lived as servants to one another or to our world this past week? What needs or opportunities to serve is God is asking us to lean into?
- How have we lived on mission where we live, work, play, or went this past week? Who do we know that needs to hear the good news of Jesus?
- 2) What did you find most significant about this message? How did it encourage you and challenge you?
- 3) Read 1 Cor. 15:1-11. What important points does Paul recount as historical facts for the Corinthian church? What questions does this passage raise for you?
- 4) Read Matthew 28:1-7. Discuss this account of the empty tomb. What do you find interesting about this account?
- 5) Read Mark 16:9-11 and John 20:19. How would you describe the state of the disciples in these passages? Why is the resurrection of Jesus the best explanation for the spread of Christianity?
- 6) Jesus fulfilled close to 500 prophecies from the Old Testament. Read Isaiah 53, Micah 5:2, Psalm 22, and Psalm 40:6-8. How does Jesus fulfill these prophecies? How does this help us trust Jesus as the risen Saviour King?
- 7) Read Matt. 16:13-16. What are the implications if Peter is right? How do you answer this question from Jesus? What action steps do you need to take today?

Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead?

Jesus of Nazareth was a remarkable individual.

Albert Einstein - "As a child I received instruction both in the Bible and in the Talmud. I am a Jew, but I am enthralled by the luminous figure of the Nazarene.... No one can read the Gospels without feeling the actual presence of Jesus. His personality pulsates in every word. No myth is filled with such life."

H. G. Wells (British Historian) "I am an historian, I am not a believer, but I must confess as a historian that this penniless preacher from Nazareth is irrevocably the very center of history. Jesus Christ is easily the most dominant figure in all history."

"About this time there lived Jesus, a wise man, if indeed one ought to call him a man. For he was one who performed surprising deeds and was a teacher of such people as accept the truth gladly. He won over many Jews and many of the Greeks. He was [thought to be] the Messiah. And when, upon the accusation of the principal men among us, Pilate had condemned him to a cross, those who had first come to love him did not cease. He appeared to them spending a third day restored to life, for the prophets of God had foretold these things and a thousand other marvels about him. And the tribe of the Christians, so called after him, has still to this day not disappeared.

Josephus - Jewish Antiquities, 18.3.3"

1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (NLT) Let me now remind you, dear brothers and sisters, of the Good News I preached to you before. You welcomed it then, and you still stand firm in it. 2 It is this Good News that saves you if you continue to believe the message I told you-unless, of course, you believed something that was never true in the first place. ³ I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. 4 He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. 5 He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. ⁶ After that, he was seen by more than 500 of his followers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles. 8 Last of all, as though I had been born at the wrong time, I also saw him. ⁹ For I am the least of all the apostles. In fact, I'm not even worthy to be called an apostle after the way I persecuted God's church. 10 But whatever I am now, it is all because God poured out his special favour on me-and not without results. For I have worked harder than any of the other apostles; yet it was not I but God who was working through me by his grace. 11 So it makes no difference whether I preach or they preach, for we all preach the same message you have already believed.

Four Compelling Reasons Why we can Believe in the Resurrection.

• Christ fulfilled prophecy. v. 3 "Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said."

Isaiah 53:3-6

- Christ was dead. v. 4 "He was buried..."
- Christ was raised. v. 4 "...and he was raised from the dead on the third day"

"The resurrection could not have been maintained in Jerusalem for a single day, a single hour, if the emptiness of the tomb had not been established as a fact for all concerned." Paul Althaus

• Christ was seen by many. v. 6-8

C.S. Lewis. "A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic – on a level with the man who says he is a poached egg – or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God; or else a madman or something worse. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God. But let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about His being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to."

Big Idea: Believe in Jesus the risen Saviour King.

Matthew 16:13-16 (NLT) ¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" ¹⁴ "Well," they replied, "some say John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets." ¹⁵ Then he asked them, "But who do you say I am?" ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

In light of the <u>evidence</u> for the <u>resurrection</u> how do you answer the question: "Who do you say I am?"
