Psalm 37:1-7 Don't worry about the wicked or envy those who do wrong.

- 2 For like grass, they soon fade away. Like spring flowers, they soon wither.
- 3 Trust in the Lord and do good.

 Then you will live safely in the land and prosper.
- 4 Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you your heart's desires.
- 5 Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust him, and he will help you.
- 6 He will make your innocence radiate like the dawn, and the justice of your cause will shine like the noonday sun.
- 7 Be still in the presence of the Lord, and wait patiently for him to act.

Don't worry about evil people who prosper or fret about their wicked schemes.

The temptation of today is to grasp at immediate satisfaction and fulfillment.

Hurry and impatience are incompatible with following Christ.

Proverbs 19:2 (ESV) Desire without knowledge is not good, and whoever makes haste with his feet misses his way.

To become people who are more like Jesus, we must learn how to wait.

Mark 6:31 (ESV) And he said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest a while."

Luke 8:15 And the seeds that fell on the good soil represent honest, good-hearted people who hear God's word, cling to it, and patiently produce a huge harvest.

We are defined and formed by our waiting.

Big Idea: Cultivate patience to be formed into Christlikeness as you hope in Jesus.

Get really <u>clear</u> on your <u>values</u> and <u>priorities</u>.
