A Prayer of Preparation

If we are going to find our way through this season we need a spiritual road map.

Psalm 143:1-4 (NLT) ¹ Hear my prayer, O Lord; listen to my plea! Answer me because you are faithful and righteous. ² Don't put your servant on trial, for no one is innocent before you. ³ My enemy has chased me. He has knocked me to the ground and forces me to live in darkness like those in the grave. ⁴ I am losing all hope; I am paralyzed with fear.

Take time for reflection and meditation.

Psalm 143:5-6 (NLT) ⁵I remember the days of old. I ponder all your great works and think about what you have done. ⁶I lift my hands to you in prayer. I thirst for you as parched land thirsts for rain. *Interlude*

AMP Bible translates Interlude (Selah) as "Pause and calmly think of that!"

· Pray for connection.

Psalm 143:7-8 Come quickly, Lord, and answer me, for my depression deepens. Don't turn away from me, or I will die. ⁸ Let me hear of your unfailing love each morning, for I am trusting you.

· Pray for direction.

Psalm 143:8b Show me where to walk, for I give myself to you.

· Pray for protection.

Psalm 143:9 Rescue me from my enemies, Lord; I run to you to hide me.

· Pray for correction.

Psalm 143:10-12 Teach me to do your will, for you are my God. May your gracious Spirit lead me forward on a firm footing.

Philippians 2:13 "For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him."

Psalm 143:11-12 For the glory of your name, O Lord, preserve my life. Because of your faithfulness, bring me out of this distress. ¹² In your unfailing love, silence all my enemies and destroy all my foes, for I am your servant.

Big Idea: To flourish in seasons of fear & uncertainty fuel your faith through worship & prayer.
