Psalm 125 Those who trust in the Lord are as secure as Mount Zion; they will not be defeated but will endure forever.

- **2** Just as the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the Lord surrounds his people, both now and forever.
- 3 The wicked will not rule the land of the godly, for then the godly might be tempted to do wrong.
- ⁴ O Lord, do good to those who are good, whose hearts are in tune with you.
- 5 But banish those who turn to crooked ways, O Lord. Take them away with those who do evil. May Israel have peace!

We are in a battle for security.

v. 3 The wicked will not rule the land of the godly, for then the godly might be tempted to do wrong.

Galatians 6:7-8 Don't be misled—you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant. ⁸ Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death from that sinful nature. But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit.

Real security is found through living in the Spirit.

- 4) **Meaning:** What was the meaning for the original recipients? What meaning is inferred in this passage for us as we journey with God?
- 5) Read Galatians 6:7-9. What does this passage mean for us today?
- 6) **Application:** How is God speaking to you through this passage? Where have you been finding your security in life? How can you further cultivate a life in the Spirit today?



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
