Be on guard. Stand firm in the faith. Be courageous. Be strong. And do everything with love. (1 Corinthians 16:13-14)

Followers of Jesus are always in danger.

"Stay alert! Watch out for your great enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour." (1 Peter 5:8)

"Put on all of God's armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil. ¹² For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places." (Ephesians 6:11-12)

The Question: How do we live in the midst of danger so that the gospel will move forward and we become more fully formed in Christ?

Big Idea: Since danger abounds, live on <u>High Alert</u> moving forward with Love.

Living on High Alert:

Be on guard

"Keep watch and pray, so that you will not give in to temptation. For the spirit is willing, but the body is weak!" (Matthew 26:41)

Stand firm

"But you must continue to believe this truth and stand firmly in it. Don't drift away from the assurance you received when you heard the Good News." (Colossians 1:23)

Be brave

"This is my command—be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

Be strong

"Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power." (Ephesians 6:10)

"Do everything with love." (1 Cor. 16:14)
