Standing in the Gap (#8 of 11) Aug. 13, 2017

- 1) Take some time to discuss how your IC has been and will live out the Kingdom of Jesus together.
- In what ways have we been living like family recently? How will we live out our family identity in the coming week?
- How have we lived as servants to one another or to our world this past week? What needs or opportunities to serve is God is asking us to lean into?
- How have we lived on mission where we live, work, play, or went this past week? Who do we know that needs to hear the good news of Jesus?
- 2) What in Sunday's sermon resonated with you? What impacted you? Was did you find interesting or compelling about the story of Moses?
- 3) Read and reflect on the story of Moses, and his role as a mediator. What does this tell us about God and what does it tell us about us? Exodus 5:1-2, 6:6-8, 17:5-6, 19:5-12, Deuteronomy 10:12-13.
- 4) Read Romans 8:3-4. What does this tell you about your need to "measure up to God"? In what way is this hard for you to accept? In what way do you need to apply this truth to your life? How is this truth "Good News" today?
- 5) Read Hebrews 10:19-22. In what way does Jesus give us access to God? What accomplished this for us? How does this make you feel?
- 6) Read 1 Timothy 2:5. In what way is Jesus "the bridge" between God and people? What implications does this have for you and your IC?
- 7) What aspect of Christ's mediating work is most significant to you today and why is this the case?
- 8) In what way do you need to "step on the bridge" to pursue your relationship with Christ? What is God asking you to do today?

Ecclesiastes 3:11b [God] has planted eternity in the human heart, but even so, people cannot see the whole scope of God's work from beginning to end.

As a mediator for Israel Moses secures...

Freedom from <u>Slavery</u> and <u>Death</u>.

Promises from God.

Big Idea: <u>Trusting</u> in Jesus as our <u>Mediator</u> is the <u>bridge</u> to the gifts secured by His mediating work.

Jesus <u>frees</u> us from slavery and death.

Romans 8:1-2. So now there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ Jesus. ² And because you belong to him, the power of the life-giving Spirit has freed you from the power of sin that leads to death.

• Jesus fulfills the promises of God.

2 Cor. 1:20

Jesus provides life in all its fullness.

John 10:10 (AMP) The thief comes only in order to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have and enjoy life, and have it in abundance [to the full, till it overflows].

Jesus <u>fulfills</u> the requirements of the Law on our behalf.

Romans 8:3-4

• Jesus grants us access to our holy God.

Hebrews 10:19-22 And so, dear brothers and sisters, we can boldly enter heaven's Most Holy Place because of the blood of Jesus. ²⁰ By his death, Jesus opened a new and life-giving way through the curtain into the Most Holy Place. ²¹ And since we have a great High Priest who rules over God's house, ²² let us go right into the presence of God with sincere hearts fully trusting him. For our guilty consciences have been sprinkled with Christ's blood to make us clean, and our bodies have been washed with pure water.
