Hope is Alive

Big Idea: Our trials don't define us but they can refine us.

How can we ensure we are refined by our trials and not defined by our trials?

1 Peter 1:3-9 (NIV) Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴ and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, ⁵ who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶ In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. ⁷ These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. ⁸ Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, ⁹ for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

• Our trials don't define us but they can refine us.

This happens by focusing on our <u>spiritual inheritance</u> instead of our circumstances.

1 Peter 1:6-7 "In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. ⁷ These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed."

2 Corinthians 4:17 (NIV) "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."

What trial has the Lord allowed in your life to help refine you?

Romans 5:3-5 (NLT) We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they help us develop endurance. ⁴ And endurance develops strength of character, and character strengthens our confident hope of salvation. ⁵ And this hope will not lead to disappointment. For we know how dearly God loves us, because he has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with his love.

When trials come respond in faith with <u>confidence</u>, <u>perseverance</u>, & <u>courage</u>.

- Respond with Confidence.
- Respond with Perseverance.
- Respond with Courage.

The <u>trials</u> (life, death, & resurrection) of Jesus, ultimately define us as Christians.
