Matthew 6:7-15 (NIV) "And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. This, then, is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. The Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.' #### • Ask God for your needs.

"Give us today our daily bread"

#### • Confess your sin & repent.

"And forgive us our debts"

1 John 1:9 (NIV) "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

#### Ask for help in <u>forgiving</u> others.

"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors"

<sup>14</sup> For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."

#### • Pray for God's strength & protection.

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one"

1 Corinthians 10:13 (NLT) "The temptations in your life are no different from what others experience. And God is faithful. He will not allow the temptation to be more than you can stand. When you are tempted, he will show you a way out so that you can endure."
