# Why did God give us family? So that we can know and reflect our Triune God and His Kingdom.

Philippians 1:9-11 "I pray that your love will overflow more and more, and that you will keep on growing in knowledge and understanding. <sup>10</sup> For I want you to understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return. <sup>11</sup> May you always be filled with the fruit of your salvation—the righteous character produced in your life by Jesus Christ—for this will bring much glory and praise to God."

Big Idea: To have a flourishing family pursue the goal of helping one another be... <u>Filled</u> with Love, <u>Faithful</u> in Character, and <u>Fruitful</u> for Christ.

### **Filled with Love:**

v. 9 "your love will overflow more and more, and that you keep on growing in knowledge & understanding."

#### **Faithful in Character:**

v. 10 "so you understand what really matters"

AMP "So that you may surely learn to sense what is vital, and approve and prize what is excellent and of real value [recognizing the highest and the best, and distinguishing the moral differences]"

### **Fruitful for Christ:**

v. 11 [having been] "filled with the fruit of your salvation - the righteous character produced.... by Jesus Christ."
