The Cost of Christmas is Not What You Think

What will Christmas cost us?

Matthew 1:18-25 (NLT) This is how Jesus the Messiah was born. His mother, Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. But before the marriage took place, while she was still a virgin, she became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Joseph, to whom she was engaged, was a righteous man and did not want to disgrace her publicly, so he decided to break the engagement quietly. ²⁰ As he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. "Joseph, son of David," the angel said, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For the child within her was conceived by the Holy Spirit. ²¹ And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet: ²³ "Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" ²⁴ When Joseph woke up, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded and took Mary as his wife. ²⁵ But he did not have sexual relations with her until her son was born. And Joseph named him Jesus.

Matthew 1:20 "Joseph, son of David," the angel said, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife."

Because Christmas will cost us our <u>self-determination</u>...

We need courage to follow where Jesus leads.

Matthew 1:21 "And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

Luke 9:23 "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves..."

Matthew 1:24-25 "When Joseph woke up, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded and took Mary as his wife. ²⁵ But he did not have sexual relations with her until her son was born. And Joseph named him Jesus."

Because Christmas will cost us our <u>pride</u>...
 We need courage to admit our need.

Matthew 1:23 "Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'"

Big Idea: <u>Comprehend</u> the <u>cost</u> Christ paid for you to be filled with <u>courage</u> to follow.

How do make this applicable today?

- Ask Jesus to make you more concerned about His <u>reputation</u> than yours.
- Admit your sin of <u>self-determination</u> and <u>surrender</u> to His loving leadership today.
