- 2. If *you* were looking for a small group of people to start a world-changing movement, what qualities would you be looking for?
- 3. Reflect on the story and the various instructions Jesus gave Simon Peter. If you were Simon Peter, how would you have responded throughout the "interview"? What thoughts and emotions would you have experienced? What choices would you have made?
- 4. Why do you think God desires to primarily work in the world through partnership with people? Have you in any way felt like a partner or coworker with God? If so, what has your experience been like?
- 5. How did Jesus model the obedience, humility, and dedication that he was looking for in Simon Peter? (See John 12:49 and14:31, Matthew 20:24-28, and Luke 22:41-43).
- 6. How is Jesus speaking to you today regarding these Christ-following characteristics? In what areas of your life are you struggling to say, "If you say so," "I'm here to serve," or "Not my will, but yours be done"?
- 7. Discuss how as an Impact Community you can live out together, and help each other as individuals live out these Christ-following characteristics.

Luke 5:1-11

One day as Jesus was preaching on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, great crowds pressed in on him to listen to the word of God. ² He noticed two empty boats at the water's edge, for the fishermen had left them and were washing their nets. ³ Stepping into one of the boats, Jesus asked Simon, its owner, to push it out into the water. So he sat in the boat and taught the crowds from there.

- ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Now go out where it is deeper, and let down your nets to catch some fish."
- ⁵ "Master," Simon replied, "we worked hard all last night and didn't catch a thing. But if you say so, I'll let the nets down again." ⁶ And this time their nets were so full of fish they began to tear! ⁷ A shout for help brought their partners in the other boat, and soon both boats were filled with fish and on the verge of sinking.
- ⁸ When Simon Peter realized what had happened, he fell to his knees before Jesus and said, "Oh, Lord, please leave me—I'm too much of a sinner to be around you." ⁹ For he was awestruck by the number of fish they had caught, as were the others with him. ¹⁰ His partners, James and John, the sons of Zebedee, were also amazed.

Jesus replied to Simon, "Don't be afraid! From now on you'll be fishing for people!" ¹¹ And as soon as they landed, they left everything and followed Jesus.
