Messengers Approved by God

How do we live out our faith and thrive in the face of opposition?

1 Thessalonians 2:1-2 You yourselves know, dear brothers and sisters, that our visit to you was not a failure. ² You know how badly we had been treated at Philippi just before we came to you and how much we suffered there. Yet our God gave us the courage to declare his Good News to you boldly, in spite of great opposition.

God's purposes are fulfilled in the $\underline{\text{midst}}$ of opposition, not in the $\underline{\text{absence}}$ of opposition.

Big Idea: <u>Learn</u> to share the Good News of Jesus in the face of opposition through a <u>reliance</u> on God's power and <u>connection</u> with Christian community.

We share the Good News in the face of opposition with:

A Rooted Identity.

1 Thessalonians 2:4 For we speak as messengers approved by God to be entrusted with the Good News. Our purpose is to please God, not people. He alone examines the motives of our hearts.

How can you live from an identity in Jesus rather than live for an identity in the world?

A Sincere and Genuine Approach.

1 Thessalonians 2:5 Never once did we try to win you with flattery, as you well know. And God is our witness that we were not pretending to be your friends just to get your money! ⁶ As for human praise, we have never sought it from you or anyone else.

How can you grow in your reliance on the work of the Holy Spirit?

A Real and Shared Life.

1 Thessalonians 2:7-8 As apostles of Christ we certainly had a right to make some demands of you, but instead we were like children among you. Or we were like a mother feeding and caring for her own children. 8 We loved you so much that we shared with you not only God's Good News but our own lives, too.

What are the already existing areas of your life where you can invite other people in and begin to share your life with them?

Intentional Living.

1 Thessalonians 2:9-11 Don't you remember, dear brothers and sisters, how hard we worked among you? Night and day we toiled to earn a living so that we would not be a burden to any of you as we preached God's Good News to you. 10 You yourselves are our witnesses—and so is God—that we were devout and honest and faultless toward all of you believers. 11 And you know that we treated each of you as a father treats his own children.

How can you grow in your love for Jesus so that you can intentionally be on mission with Him?

A View of <u>Eternity</u>.

1 Thessalonians 2:12-13 We pleaded with you, encouraged you, and urged you to live your lives in a way that God would consider worthy. For he called you to share in his Kingdom and glory. 13 Therefore, we never stop thanking God that when you received his message from us, you didn't think of our words as mere human ideas. You accepted what we said as the very word of God—which, of course, it is. And this word continues to work in you who believe.

How can you remind yourself of the eternal significance of the Gospel?

- 7) Share which of the 5 areas God is asking you to focus on. How might He be asking you to grow in that area this week?
- 8) How can you remind yourself, and each other, that the Gospel of Jesus fulfills every part of life?
- 9) Take time as an IC to discuss and plan engagement around the "Helping the Homeless" Missional Focus for Feb. and March.



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
