### Season of the Cross: Gold for Eastertide

All the hopes and expectations of Christians are realized in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, making Easter the most celebrative day of the church year. Because the good news of Easter can hardly be contained in a single day's celebration, Easter is only the first of fifty days of Eastertide—the season leading up to Pentecost. This season is designed for extended celebration, exploring the ramifications of Easter for the redemption of all creation, and for joyful Christian living.

# Call to Worship: Exodus 33:18-19; 34:6-7

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

#### People: Lord, please show us your glory!

Leader: I will make all my goodness pass before you and will proclaim before you my name... The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty.

### **Song of Ascent**

The first song we sing together guides us as we "go up" or approach the presence of God to worship Him. This song is meant to rouse us to worship and awaken our hearts.

### Reading of the Law: Psalm 41:1-2
