

## Season of the Cross: Green for Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time is the long season that takes up three quarters of the church year. This portion of Ordinary Time runs between Pentecost and Advent. Ordinary Time has traditionally been devoted to seeking our Lord in the simple, ordinary day-in and day-out rhythms of life. It is a time in which we are all invited to order our lives around Christ's life and teaching.

### Call to Worship: Psalm 27

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

Leader: The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

People: Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war rise against me, yet I will be confident.

Leader: One thing I have asked of the Lord, that I will seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord.

People: For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will lift me high upon a rock.

## Reading of the Law: Psalm 15

While the law cannot justify us or make us righteous; it is a teacher given to lead us to Christ, the fulfiller of the law.

1 O LORD, who shall sojourn in your tent? Who shall dwell on your holy hill? 2 He who walks blamelessly and does what is right and speaks truth in his heart; 3 who does not slander with his tongue and does no evil to his neighbor, nor takes up a reproach against his friend; 4 in whose eyes a vile person is despised, but who honors those who fear the LORD; who swears to his own hurt and does not change; 5 who does not put out his money at interest and does not take a bribe against the innocent. He who does these things shall never be moved.

## **Prayer of Adoration and Confession**

We pray together, praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

### Assurance of Pardon: Romans 8:31-32, 35-38

We read God's Word together and are reminded that grace and mercy are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?

...35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? 36 As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." 37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

**Confession of Faith:** Westminster Larger Catechism 146-148

As an expression of our faith in Jesus Christ in solidarity with his people, we declare the substance of what we believe.

- Q. 146. What is the tenth commandment?
- A. The tenth commandment is: You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.
- Q. 147. What does the tenth commandment require?
- A. The tenth commandment requires that we be so completely satisfied with our own status in life and have such a proper, loving attitude toward others that we are naturally inclined to wish the best for them and all their possessions.
- Q. 148. What particular sins does the tenth commandment forbid?
- A. The tenth commandment forbids any dissatisfaction with what belongs to us, envy and grief at the success of others, and all improper desire for anything that belongs to someone else.

### **Proclamation of God's Word**

5:1 Seeing the crowds, he went up on the mountain, and when he sat down, his disciples came to him. 2 And he opened his mouth and taught them, saying...

7:13 "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. 14 For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few."

21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22 On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' 23 And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'

24 "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. 25 And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. 26 And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. 27 And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

28 And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, 29 for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.

Sermon Series: The Sermon on the Mount: Kingdom Ethics

Sermon Title: Built Tough By Grace

**Date:** August 11, 2024

Hook: Two ways (Matt 7:13). Two trees (Matt 7:15). Two builders

(Matt 7:24). ... Which are you?

#### I. BUILDING ON THE ROCK

"It is almost universally conceded today that you can be a Christian without being a disciple." - Dallas Willard

### II. KNOWING THE GOD OF GRACE

"The astounding things men can do in public is no certain indication of where they stand in private before the judgment of Jesus Christ." - Sinclair Ferguson

**Takeaway:** Take Jesus seriously (Matt 7:28-29).



The word "gospel" never appears in the letters of John. Yet it is hard to imagine a book more intimately connected to the gospel of saving grace in Christ Jesus than John's first letter, and in each of his other two letters John deals with a practical issue arising directly out of a care for the integrity of the gospel in the life of the church.

In 1 John the themes of fellowshiping with God, genuinely believing in the unique person and work of Jesus, walking in the light, practicing righteousness, loving other Christians, and especially, being assured of eternal life are all deeply rooted in gospel reality, especially its transformative power.

John writes his first letter to "you who believe in the name of the Son of God" so "that you may know that you have eternal life." Two purposes are contained here: (1) that professing believers might test themselves to see the genuineness of their faith; and (2) that true believers would be assured of their right standing with God. In these purposes John helps all professing believers avoid a dangerous presumption and he helps all genuine believers avoid a debilitating uncertainty.

The bulk of John's first letter is taken up with three tests of genuine faith: (1) the moral test—do you obey God's commands? (2) the doctrinal test—do you believe Jesus is the Son of God? (3) the love test—do you love God and his children? Early in the letter these tests appear distinctly, but as John proceeds they are increasingly intertwined into a unified picture of the truly gospel-transformed life.
