## Season of the Cross: Gold for Eastertide

All the hopes and expectations of Christians are realized in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, making Easter the most celebrative day of the church year. Because the good news of Easter can hardly be contained in a single day's celebration, Easter is only the first of fifty days of Eastertide—the season leading up to Pentecost. This season is designed for extended celebration, exploring the ramifications of Easter for the redemption of all creation, and for joyful Christian living.

# Call to Worship: Hebrews 10:19, 22-23

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

Leader: Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

People: Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful.

## **Song of Ascent**

The first song we sing together guides us as we "go up" or approach the presence of God to worship Him. This song is meant to rouse us to worship and awaken our hearts.

**Reading of the Law:** Prov. 19:11; 22:24–25; 29:2; 2 Cor. 13:11 While the law cannot justify us or make us righteous; it is a teacher given to lead us to Christ, the fulfiller of the law.

- 11 Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is his glory to overlook an offense...
- 24 Make no friendship with a man given to anger, nor go with a wrathful man, 25 lest you learn his ways and entangle yourself in a snare...
- 22 A man of wrath stirs up strife, and one given to anger causes much transgression.
- 11 Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

... 31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. 1 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. 2 And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.
