Proclamation of God 's Word: Pg 877 in Pew Bible

1 And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. 2 He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man. 3 And there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary.' 4 For a while he refused, but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor respect man, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will give her justice, so that she will not beat me down by her continual coming.' " 6 And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. 7 And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? zWill he delay long over them? 8 I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

9 He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt: 10 "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. 11 The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. 12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' 13 But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Luke 18:1-14 (ESV)

Discussion Questions

1. What would you say are the main barriers to prayer in your life?

2. When you don't pray, what do you do with all your "stuff"? (Look in? Look out?). How is your heart right now?

3. Paul didn't pray for a change of circumstances for his people, but for them to know Jesus more deeply. He knew God has a greater agenda for us than we do for ourselves. Paul Miller said, "Prayer doesn't offer us a less busy life; it offers us a less busy heart." Talk about that.

4. Prayer is a movement from independence ("I got this!") to dependence upon our Heavenly Father. Jesus himself said, "I can do nothing on my own" (John 5:30). How does that idea sound to you? How is it difficult for you?

5. Where have you "lost heart" (Lk. 18:1) and quit praying? How does this parable encourage you to keep "bothering" God?

6. What are some practical steps you could take this week to grow in your prayer life?
