Proclamation of God's Word: Page 61 & 812 in Pew Bible

1 And God spoke all these words, saying, 2 "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery... 7 "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.

Exodus 20:1-2, 4-6 (ESV)

15 "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. 16 You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? 17 So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. 18 A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. 19 Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 20 Thus you will recognize them by their fruits.

21 "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22 On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' 23 And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness.'

Discussion Questions

1. Why are names so significant? Does your, or your children's names, have any special meaning? Do you have any stories of where you "dropped" someone's name to gain access/respect?

2. The Bible constantly talks about the weightiness of God's name (Psalm 8; 29:2; Matt. 6:9; Phil. 2:10; Col.3:17). What does the third commandment mean? How do we "hallow" God's name? How does it make you think about the way you use God's name?

3. Had you ever thought about this commandment through the lens of hypocrisy? What is most shocking to you about Jesus' story in Matthew 7:21-23? (Notice the repetition of "in your name" v22). How does this story lead you to reflect on the idea of, or reconsider, what true spirituality is?

4. The gospel is the Good News that through Christ, God has adopted us by grace and given us the family name. How does this both challenge and comfort you?
