# Season of the Cross: Purple for Advent

The season of Advent, a season of waiting, is designed to cultivate our awareness of God's actions—past, present, and future. In Advent, we hear the prophecies of the Messiah's coming as addressed to us—people who wait for the second coming. In Advent, we heighten our anticipation for the ultimate fulfillment of all Old Testament promises, when the wolf will lie down with the lamb, death will be swallowed up, and every tear will be wiped away. In this way Advent highlights for us the larger story of God's redemptive plan.

#### **Advent Introduction**

Every year, for the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, we observe the season of Advent. The word Advent refers to the arrival of something, or Someone, of vast importance. It is a time for both honest reflection and hopeful anticipation.

The world has changed. Much that once was has now been lost. We all feel it. The prophet Isaiah wrote to a people in exile. Yet, he dared to put God's dream for a better future into words that his people could live by. He spoke of a kingdom not of their own doing. It would be a gift. The remaking of the whole world. Brought about, not through human effort, but by God's special Representative. The One. The singular Person who would succeed in all the ways the people themselves had failed. The only One in all of heaven and earth who is worthy to make God's dream for the world a reality. He was known to Isaiah by many titles. The Child. The King. The Servant. The Messenger. We know Him by name - Jesus Christ.

This Advent, we celebrate Jesus' coming into the world to rescue us, even as we look and ache for him to come again, with the kingdom in hand, to finally set us – and the world with us – right.

# **Advent Theme:** Faith

The prophet Isaiah describes the world as a place of deep darkness and gloom. Instead of being God's light, all too often, even we his people are a part of that darkness. But there is a Light from outside the world that shines into the darkness. All the shadows flee before it. A child. **The** Child. The One who would burn so brightly, so beautifully, that he would light up the whole world. So much so, that one day soon, when his kingdom is finally all-theway here, there will be no more night. Oh, and no more sun. And no more moon. Only his glory.

Our Advent theme this week is **faith**. Against all of our lingering fear and unbelief, we light a candle as an act of faith in the One who has come into our darkness and will come again to banish it forever. Jesus Christ is the light of the world. "Whoever believes in him will not perish but will have eternal life" (John 3:16).

# Advent Reading: John 1:1-5, 11-14

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it... He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

## **Prayer of Adoration and Confession**

We pray together, praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

## **Song of Advent**

In this song of repentance we acknowledge our need of a Savior and anticipate His return.

#### O Come O Come Emmanuel

#### Assurance of Pardon: 1 John 1:5-9

We read God's Word together and are reminded that grace and mercy are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

## Greeting

In Jesus, we have not only been reconciled to God, we have also been reconciled to one another. Therefore, we greet one another as brothers and sisters.
