## Season of the Cross: Green for Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time is the long season that takes up three quarters of the church year. This portion of Ordinary Time runs between Pentecost and Advent. Ordinary Time has traditionally been devoted to seeking our Lord in the simple, ordinary day-in and day-out rhythms of life. It is a time in which we are all invited to order our lives around Christ's life and teaching.

# Call to Worship: Psalm 13

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reminds us of who God is and what He expects from us.

Leader: How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? Will you hide your faith from me?

#### People: Look at me, O Lord, my God! Renew my strength!

Leader: But I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation.

People: I will sing to the Lord, because He has dealt bountifully with me.

## **Song of Ascent**

The first song we sing together guides us as we "go up" or approach the presence of God to worship Him. This song is meant to rouse us to worship and awaken our hearts.

# Praise to the Lord, the Almighty

#### Reading of the Law: Colossians 3:23-24

While the law cannot justify us or make us righteous; it is a teacher given to lead us to Christ, the fulfiller of the law.

23 Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, 24 knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.

## **Prayer of Adoration and Confession**

We pray together, praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

#### **Songs of Repentance**

In this song of repentance we acknowledge our sin and our need of a Savior.

# Upon a Life

#### Assurance of Pardon: Luke 12:22, 29-34

We read God's Word together and are reminded that grace and mercy are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

22 And he said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat, nor about your body, what you will put on... 29 And do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, nor be worried. 30 For all the nations of the world seek after these things, and your Father knows that you need them. 31 Instead, seek his kingdom, and these things will be added to you.

...32 "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. 33 Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. 34 For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

**Confession of Faith:** Westminster Larger Catechism 107-109 As an expression of our faith in Jesus Christ in solidarity with his people, we declare the substance of what we believe.

Q. 107. What is the second commandment?

A. The second commandment is: You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God

Q. 108. What does the second commandment require?

A. The second commandment requires us to receive, respectfully perform, and preserve completely and purely all the regulations for religion and worship that God has established in his word. These include: prayer; the reading, preaching, and hearing of the word; the administration of and receiving the sacraments; church government and discipline; the administration and upkeep of the church.

Q. 109. What particular sins does the second commandment forbid?

A. The second commandment forbids: imagining, recommending, demanding, practicing, or in any way approving any religious worship not established by God himself; creating any likeness of God as the Trinity or as anyone of his three persons, either internally in our minds or externally in the form of any kind of image or representation of a created being; any worship of such created likenesses as if God were in them or as if they were a means to worshiping him... Also forbidden are: any departure from the true worship of God by adding to or taking away from it, whether by our own invention or received from some other tradition... and finally any neglect of, contempt for, hindering, or opposition to the worship and regulations established by God.

## **Receiving New Members**

As was the case for believers in the Old and New Testaments, we are called to publicly confess our faith in the grace of God, to participate in the rituals of entrance into the people of God (circumcision in the Old and baptism in the New), and to acknowledge our membership with His people.

# **Until He Returns**

Paul's second letter to the Thessalonians is a letter of comfort to those eagerly awaiting the promised return of Jesus Christ. Since receiving Paul's first letter, the Thessalonians' faith in Christ and their love for one another had continued to grow abundantly while they endured affliction for the sake of the gospel. Paul writes to encourage them to remain steadfast in their commitment to the gospel and the doctrine they had learned from the apostles. False prophets had been spreading rumors suggesting that the "day of the Lord" (2 Thess. 2:2; cf. 2 Thess. 1:10) had already come, and Paul writes to set the record straight by providing further details about the events surrounding the second coming of Christ.

Paul also deals with misbehavior that has been a consequence of the Thessalonians' misunderstanding. While awaiting the coming day of the Lord, some of the believers at Thessalonica had become unwilling to work. Paul urges the believers to continue to work and not to grow weary in doing good while waiting in hope for God's impending vengeance against the wicked and his salvation of his chosen people. Just as God called us through the gospel, so he is faithful to his promise to guard us and establish us in every good work until Jesus returns.
