New Hope Community Church March 27th, 2022 / Luke 23:13-31

A. Exploring the Depths of Depravity (13-25)

- 1. In Pilate, the man responsible to administer justice
 - He chose to ignore the absence of any guilt in Jesus
 - He exalted evil above righteousness
 - He caved into the idolatry of serving self
 - He refused to embrace truth even in contrast to lies
 - He turned a deaf ear to conscience
 - He denied responsibility for his own evil heart
- 2. In the religious leaders, those responsible to welcome Messiah
 - They had no interest in justice
 - They were willing to embrace evil over righteousness
 - They betrayed their children in the passion of their evil desires

B. Realizing the Consequences of Depravity (26-31)

- 1. The judgment for rejecting Messiah would be horrific
 - In that day you will think yourself blessed to be childless
 - In that day you will long to escape by a quick death
- 2. Roman contempt for Jewish lives will be unimaginable
 - The green tree represents Jesus, Messiah, the source of life
 - The dry tree represents a spiritually dry Israel, without life

<u>Personal Reflection</u>

- All of mankind is depraved, morally corrupt. We are no different than Pilate nor the Jewish religious leaders!
- 1) We have all sinned and rebelled against God
 'All of us like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned to his
 own way' (Is 53:6) 'By nature we are children of wrath' (Eph 2:3)
- 2) God in His mercy has provided His Son to **take** our punishment 'The LORD has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him' (Is 53:6) 'He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities' (Is 53:5)
- 3) To reject God's salvation is to ignore the truth like Pilate.
 'Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me." (Jn 14:6)
- The consequences of our depravity either fall on Jesus or they will fall on us **Revelation 20:11-15**
