In Hebrews, we see three major — and continual — themes. First, Jesus Christ is greater than any angel, priest, or old covenant practice. Second, Christians must not forsake the great salvation that Jesus has brought about. And third, believers must hold on by faith to the true rest found in Christ, and must encourage others in the church to do the same.

## **Group Discussion**

Main Text:

Hebrews 10:22-29, Hebrews 11:1-39

- 1. Read Hebrews 10:22-25. What practices or disciplines help you to draw near to God and feel encouraged in your faith? What are the primary barriers that keep you from doing these daily? How can you remove those barriers?
- 2. Read Hebrews 10:26-29. Do you ever treat sin casually? How does minimizing your sin minimize the significance of Jesus?
- 3. Hebrews 11 is known as, "The Hall of Faith." Each person in your group should take time to look over this chapter and discuss which example of faith stands out to them the most. Why?
- 4. Read Hebrews 11:6. Why is faith a necessity to pleasing God?
