DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What stands out to you most about the David and Goliath story?
- 2. What is something you fear? Has fear ever caused you to do something, or not do something, you regret?
- 3. When have you faced a circumstance that felt overwhelming or that was more than you could handle? Did you factor in God? How did it go?
- 4. David brought a new perspective. He didn't see Goliath as a national problem, or as a personal problem, David saw it as a God problem. Where in your life do you need to have this perspective and turn something over to God?
- 5. God values you so much he was willing to pay with Jesus' life to bring you into his family. How well do you do at thinking of yourself as valuable to God? What would it look like if you lived out of that perspective of being valued by God?
- 6. Our biggest fears are God's biggest opportunities to show the world who God is. So what are you afraid of? How can that point people around you to Jesus?

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
