LUKER FROM THE STORM

Luke: Shelter From The Storm (May 16 to June13) Jesus told us, "In this world you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world." In other words, storms are inevitable. No matter how well you prepare, no matter what measures you take to prevent it, the storm is coming. The only question is, where will you seek shelter?

Group Discussion

Getting started: What is the worst storm you've ever seen or experienced?

Scripture: Luke 6:46-49, John 16:33

- 1. Read John 16:33. According to Jesus, storms in life are inevitable. Why is this important for us to know?
- 2. "Storms don't build strength, they reveal it." Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Think back to the last storm you went through in your life. What things did it reveal about you that you were proud of? What things did it reveal that you weren't very proud of?
- 3. Read Luke 6:46-48. What is the problem Jesus is addressing in verse 46? What leads to a solid foundation?
- 4. The goal of every sermon is to read scripture and help people understand what they need to know, what to feel, and what to do. Most people gravitate towards one of these three. Are you a knower, a feeler, or a doer? Why are each of these important? How can you grow in the ones that you're not as strong in?
- 5. Read Luke 6:48. What leads to a bad foundation in your life? As you examine the little decisions you've made over the past week, how's your foundation right now?

6. In the book, *Atomic Habits*, it says, "The cost of good decisions is in the present. The cost of bad decisions is in the future." What examples of this truth can you think of in your own life? What is one good decision you can make now, even if it's difficult, that will be better for you in the future? Will you do it?
