Group Discussion

Scripture: Luke 6:12-26, Matthew 6:33, 2 Corinthians 4:8-12

Getting started: If you could be a part of any friend group on television, which would you choose? Why?

Have someone read Luke 6:17-23

- 1. Why do you think Jesus decided to make this one of the first teachings he gave his disciples?
- What do you think Jesus' original audience expected him to say about who is blessed? Talk about each of these blessings and how each of them describes an attitude we have towards ourselves, others, and God.
- 3. Read Luke 6:24-26. If someone asked how you know if your life is going well, what would you say? Of the four values represented in vv. 24-26 money/power, comfort, success, and recognition which one trips you up the most? What does it do to your view of God and others?
- 4. Read 2 Corinthians 4:8-12. Does that describe your life? How is Jesus better than what this world can offer, even if it means suffering?
- 5. Read Matthew 6:33. What do you long for? Does your life reflect the kingdom values Jesus is describing? What do you fear? Does fear ever keep you from living out what Jesus calls us to?

Next Steps

Why is having a kingdom mindset so important for our effectiveness in sharing Jesus with others? How is it the true marker of being part of a new community?
