

## Mantras (April 11 to May 9)

## **Group Discussion**

Scripture: John 15:1-11

**Getting started:** If you had to get a tattoo, or a new tattoo, what would it say?

- 1. Read John 15:5. Why do you think Jesus chose these words to say to his disciples right before he would be arrested and crucified?
- 2. We said in the sermon, "When you know who you are, you know what to do." Do you agree or disagree with this statement. Why?
- 3. "Be the Branch" means that our primary focus will never be on production, but on connection. Why is this important? Do you ever tend to get this backwards?
- 4. Read John 15:1 and John 15:11. Jesus says that he is the true vine, which implies that there are some fake vines too. What are some examples of fake or imitation vines? Why are fake vines dangerous?
- 5. Read John 15:6. When branches are disconnected from the vine they're just dead sticks that don't produce real fruit. As you examine your life are you "being the branch" and bearing fruit, or are you "being the stick" with only fake fruit?

## **Next Steps**

Being the branch means being connected to Jesus, the true vine.

- 1. How can you stay connected to Jesus this week?
- 2. What are you currently doing, or being called to do, that will fail if Jesus isn't in it?
