- 4. The four friends weren't evangelists, they just took their friend to Jesus. How can we take people to Jesus?
- 5. Reflect on the Mantras series. How have you been encouraged by what you have learned each week about how to "Be the Branch," "Catch the Wind," "Grip the Plow," "Empty the Jar," and "Wreck the Roof"? How do the first four mantras relate to wrecking the roof?
