INTRODUCTION

Theme of entire Bible from <u>Genesis 3</u> on, when Adam & Eve sinned, is God restoring what was lost in the Garden; restoring world as God created it to be; restoring our relationship with Him as He created it to be, which is what will fully & finally happen when Jesus returns to set up God's Kingdom on earth

- Second coming of Jesus, *His Glorious Appearing*, is the second-most frequently mentioned doctrine in all Bible; only the subject of salvation is mentioned more frequently
- Although there are various interpretations about *when* He may reappear, there is absolutely no question that Jesus *will* come again

One of most significant passages in Bible on subject of end times is *Matthew 24 & 25*; passage is also one of most difficult to interpret

- There are many different thoughts & it's easy to get lost in the details so we're going to look at simple meanings & big picture
- Important to remember that all prophecy is *not* given to fill our heads with facts; to win arguments & make charts & timelines
- Prophecy is <u>not</u> given to *inform* us but to *transform* us; any time the Bible gives glimpses into future, it's to change how we live *right now*

TWO MAIN IDEAS from Matthew 24 & 25

First: The World is **Not** Falling Apart; it's Falling into Place

- God is absolutely Sovereign; He controls all drama in lives & world
- And not only is God Sovereign, He's purposeful; *Ephesians 1:11:* "*He works all things according to the purpose of His will*"; in spite of what may appear, everything is going according to wise, good plan
- Our World is Not Falling Apart; rather, it's Falling into Place

2nd MAIN IDEA: It Matters How We Live

- It matters how we live as we see God's plan falling into place
- It matters *now* because gives evidence we belong to Jesus; matters *now* as determines how much of God we experience in our lives; it matters how we live *now* as to how much God uses us in His work
- It matters *later* when Jesus returns as to whether or not we hear Him say, "Well done", or "I don't know who you are"
- It Matters How We Live

Open Scripture to Matthew 24 (Big Picture; questions afterwards)

I. WATCH CAREFULLY (Matthew 24:1-41)

Jesus leaves temple; crosses Kidron Valley; meets privately with disciples on Mt of Olives (Garden of Gethsemane) = Olivet Discourse

- <u>24:1-2</u> Jesus predicts the destruction of the temple
- Disciples assumed Jesus was talking about end times, which He was, but Jesus was *also* predicting a destruction that would take place in 70 AD when Rome captured Jerusalem & destroyed temple

Nature of prophecy: Prophetic Mountains (talked about in <u>Matthew 2</u>)

- Prophecies are often difficult to understand because they contain multiple fulfillments, which writers & readers didn't see
- For example, two comings of Messiah were perceived as one event, which is why so many Jews didn't accept Jesus as their Messiah
- They took prophecies which said Messiah would overcome the world & set up His Kingdom on earth & applied those to His first coming
- But in His first coming, Jesus came to suffer for their sins, die on cross, & rise again, without which there would be no forgiveness of sins and no eternal life and no eternal kingdom of God on earth
- If we see key prophecies of Jesus' *two* comings as mountaintops & other events like church age (now) & Tribulation period as valleys, then much of what we read in Bible prophecies becomes clearer So, Jesus predicts downfall of temple in *near* future (40 years) as a guarantee that everything else He's going to predict will come true

- <u>24:4-12</u>, Jesus gives a panoramic view of history between His first & second comings; He says that throughout history there will be things happening, painful things, but they are <u>not</u> signs that the end of the world is near
- "Beginning" of birth pains; this is just the start, but, like birth pains, they will increase in intensity & regularity; climax during Tribulation leading directly up to Jesus' second coming
- Birth pains include what's going on in <u>whole world</u>: Imposters; false messiahs; wars; natural disasters like famines & earthquakes
- Birth pains include what's happened to <u>believers</u> throughout history: Persecution; suffering; many fall away & betray each other; lawlessness will increase & love of many for Jesus will grow cold
- For 2,000 years all these have been happening, but Jesus said don't be frightened; God's plan is falling into place; that's why in *verse* 6 Jesus said these things "*must*" take place why?

<u>Verses 13 & 14</u> shed light on a couple of God's purposes in pains:

- Verse 13: "But the one who endures to the end will be saved"
- Suffering separates true from false believers (Parable of soils)
- Endurance is NOT what saves us; it's proof we are saved
- True believers don't fall away; persevere because God's holding us
- Those who walk away from Jesus prove were never truly saved

A second purpose for what we see happening in world is in <u>Verse 14:</u> "And this gospel of the kingdom <u>will be</u> proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come"

• Suffering provides a platform for proclaiming Gospel like few other things do; people are more open to listening when suffering, & we are more likely to share Jesus when living in world full of suffering

If you've studied end times, may have opinion on Rapture of church, when & if it happens; Jesus doesn't teach Rapture in Olivet Discourse; He leaves that primarily to Paul in <u>Corinthians & Thessalonians</u>

- *Matthew 24:15-28* describe a period known as the Tribulation
- <u>Verses 29-41</u> describe Jesus' second coming following Tribulation
- Jesus says He will appear like lightning across a dark sky
- No one will miss it; there will be no question as to Who He is & whether or not He came

But people won't expect it; <u>verse 38</u>, Jesus says His coming will be like in the days before the flood; people were "eating & drinking; marrying & giving in marriage; unaware until flood came & swept them away"

- It's so easy, especially in America, to be distracted by delights of marriage & kids & vacations & careers; easy to live like this life is all there is; that's why passages like this are in Bible
- We must *Watch Carefully*; Jesus IS coming back; we don't know *when* He will return, but we must be ready when He does

TRANSITION

What does it look like to *Watch Carefully?* Jesus gives *2 Parables* to illustrate = a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning

- NOT like allegory where each thing represents something else
- Parables are big picture truths with 1 or 2 main points

And, in *Parables of 10 Virgins & Talents*, focus is NOT on people who are obviously lost, like those who perished in flood; Jesus is focusing on "look-alikes"; people who *look like* believers, people who think they are saved, but who prove by their actions they're really not

- Both are parables of warning; of separation & final judgment
- Both illustrate that it really does matter how we live

II. WAIT EXPECTANTLY (Matthew 25:1-13)

Parable of 10 Virgins; don't over-analyze; simple theme, Jesus coming back unexpectedly, so be prepared; *Wait Expectantly* for His coming

Scene of Parable is a Wedding

- A Jewish wedding was greatest social event in town; 3 parts:
 - 1. Engagement where official contract made between parents
 - 2. Betrothal with an official ceremony & vows; couple officially married, but no physical consummation; lasted 1 year or longer as groom prepared house for couple to live in (*John 14*)
 - 3. When house is ready, groom comes to take bride into house & consummate marriage; feast & celebration lasting up to 7 days

10 virgins represent bridesmaids: All carried an oil "lamp" like a bouquet; identified them as part of the wedding party; all were waiting for bridegroom to come, and all fall asleep – that's not the issue

- Though they all look alike, they were NOT alike; 5 wise & 5 foolish
- Wise took "flasks of oil" with lamps; foolish took lamps but no oil
- Oil in Bible most often represents the Holy Spirit

Every true believer has Holy Spirit living inside; proof of salvation

• <u>2 Timothy 4:8:</u> True believers "love appearing of bridegroom"; love Jesus; that's what the Holy Spirit does – creates love for Jesus

- Foolish virgins had a little oil in lamps because liked shiny lamps; liked being identified with wedding party, but didn't love bridegroom
- Not prepared for His coming; not Waiting Expectantly for Him

Bridegroom (Jesus): Big picture is that He will return at an unexpected time, & once He comes, there won't be time to get ready

- It's not that the wise virgins were selfish not to share their oil; not that they *wouldn't* they *couldn't*; salvation is non-transferable
- We cannot give others love for Jesus; that's what Holy Spirit does
- No love for Jesus means He doesn't know you personally; closes door; parable of judgment; once the door closes, it's shut forever

It matters how we live; the only <u>sure</u> way to be ready on an <u>unexpected</u> day is to be ready <u>every</u> day

- Waiting doesn't mean sitting on mountaintop staring up into sky
- Those who Wait Expectantly are also those who Work Faithfully

Have to be careful when we talk about "works" that we understand the place of works in the life of a believer; we are NOT saved by works

- Saved by grace alone through faith alone trusting in Jesus alone
- Grace produces love for Jesus so Wait Expectantly for Him (wise)

But Jesus said in John 14, "If you love Me, you will obey Me"

- Jesus is <u>not</u> saying "Get to work"; He's stating a fact
- Works are proof <u>we do</u> love Jesus, & we do have the Holy Spirit living in us to enable & empower us to *Work Faithfully*

III. WORK FAITHFULLY (Matthew 25:14-46)

Parable of the Talents: Man goes on long journey; entrusts servants with his property, "talents", in different measures

- Gives 5 talents to one; 2 to another; 1 to a third
- In Bible, a talent was a measure of money; in parable, represents anything we've been given to be used in the power of the Holy Spirit to glorify God; to make Him look good; to put Him on display
- Time; personality; gifts; education; opportunities; money; health
- When Jesus returns, we will give account for how we used them In parable, when master returns, both 5-talent & 2-talent servants have doubled them, & they both receive the same reward: <u>Verse 21:</u> "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master."

- It's not the <u>amount</u> of what we've been given that matters, but <u>what</u> we do with what we've been given
- It matters how we live; our reward will be joy; more opportunities to serve Jesus & experience presence of Jesus <u>right now & in heaven</u>

But, like third servant, a wrong view of God results in hiding what He's given us

- Not believing everything we are & everything have are gifts from God to be used for Him; not believing Jesus will return & that we will be held accountable for what we've done with His stuff
- By his actions, third servant exposes what's in his heart; not saved
- Parable of separation worthless servant is cast into hell
- To do nothing is proof that we do not love Jesus, do not belong to Him, & have no share in His kingdom; & it is to perish forever

<u>Verses 31-46</u> also speak of Working Faithfully as proof that we belong to Jesus; interestingly, it also teaches works as basis for separation

- But, in judgment of sheep & goats, Jesus distinguishes sharply between false believers and true based on how they treat others
- Remember 2 greatest commandments? Love God & love others
- When we love God rightly (like the wise virgins; the 5-talent & 2-talent servants), we will love & serve people right

Picture of final judgment where King Jesus returns & judges all people

- Separates true believers from false believers; the wheat from tares
- Puts true believers (sheep) on right = <u>Verse 34:</u> "Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" God chose us to be in His family before He created the world; not because of how good we are, but because of how Good He is; that's why Jesus says we're "blessed"
- Jesus says when we serve others, we're really serving Him
- <u>Verse 35:</u> "I was hungry & you fed me; thirsty & you gave me drink; a stranger & you welcomed me; naked & you clothed me; in prison & you visited me" = ordinary things anyone can do
- Loving & serving others flows out of our love for God; Holy Spirit does that in us so that our service is not a sacrifice, but a joy The goats (unbelievers) are surprised when they are sent into eternal punishment simply because they <u>didn't</u> do these ordinary things
- <u>Matthew 23</u> "Woes": Religious leaders of Jesus' day did their deeds to be seen by others (fasting, praying); loved place of honor at feasts & best seats in synagogues; loved being called rabbi; wouldn't be caught dead feeding a beggar on street or visiting someone in prison

Surprising emphasis in both *Parable of Talents* and the *Judgment of Sheep & Goats* is on *works*; people were judged by what they did

- Works DO NOT save us; but works are necessary evidence that we are saved; fruit of our faith, not the root of it; "if it's faith, it works"
- We are NOT justified by works, but we cannot claim to be a Christian if we do not have works
- And notice that these works are not "great" things but little things; things we *faithfully* do for others in our daily lives which are the overflow of a heart filled with *Holy-Spirit-produced* love for God

CLOSING

We live in a broken world & "we groan"; some things just don't "get better"; even when we know Jesus, we don't always "just get over it"

- For Christians, our greatest happiness in this life comes from knowing that our greatest happiness is <u>not</u> in this life
- Knowing that no matter how things appear, the world is not falling apart; it's all falling into place
- Many different views on *when* & *how* it all happens, but we all agree on one thing, Jesus wins; & by His amazing grace, we win with Him

But the reality is that it matters how we live – right now & later

- Proof that we belong to Jesus is that we are *Watching Carefully & Waiting Expectantly*; prepared to meet Him when He comes
- And, we are *Working Faithfully* right now to serve Him by serving others with whatever He's given us until *He* comes or until *we* go
- And, since Jesus has not yet returned & since we're still alive, our work is not yet done
