#1 - YOUR NOT OMNISCIENT, SO TRUST JESUS (9a,11a,13-14a)

I. What Is Omniscience?

1. Exposition

- (1) We are limited to what we know by the author, by extension, by the Lord.
- (2) Omniscient (all-knowing)
 - i. Omni all
 - ii. scientia (science) to know; knowledge
- (3) His knowledge is complete
 - i. Lk. 12 He knows the # of hairs on your head
 - ii. Ps. 147 He knows every star in the universe and knows them by name
 - iii. job 34 He knows every step we've taken
 - iv. Matt. 6 He knows every need we have
 - v. 1 Chron 28 He knows every intention and every motive of every action
 - vi. Matt. 24 There are things that angels don't even know, that God knows.
 - vii. Deut. 29 He knows secret things intentionally unrevealed to us
- (4) His knowledge is perfect
 - i. Job 21 You cannot teach God anything new
 - ii. Psalm 18 What He knows is never wrong and always perfect
 - iii. Pslams all his knowledge is always immediately and directly before his mind

 - (1) God knows our thoughts, so we can't hide from him
 - (2) God knows our sin

Psalm 69:5: "O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you"

Heb. 4:13: "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

- (2) You don't have to freak out about making wrong decisions because of what you know or don't know.
- (3) Instead, knowledge and wisdom are given to us to steward.



#2 - YOU'RE NOT OMNIPRESENT, SO TRUST JESUS (v10,12,15)

I. What Is Omnipresence?

1. Exposition

- (1) They were limited to time and space by their deaths.
- (2) Omniscient (all-present)
 - i. Omni all
 - ii. praesens (present) to be present

2. Illustration

- (1) Leading a family; Leading a church = can't be there for everyone; all the time
- (2) But this is not true of God

3. Application

- (1) God is not present in everything
 - i. Pantheism God is identical with creation (rather than separate and distinct from)
 - ii. Panentheism God is present in creation (rather than with creation)
- (2) God is naturally present in every aspect of the natural order of things, in every manner, time and place
- (3) God is present, observing everywhere.

Proverbs 15:3: "The eyes of the LORD are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good."

- i. One of the reasons he knows everything is because he sees everyone, because He is everywhere.
- (4) God is present, ruling everywhere.

Pslam 103:19: The LORD has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all.

i. God is present in heaven ruling and reigning over all our affairs

<mark>Isaiah 41:10</mark> "...fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand..."

- ii. God is present with us convicting, comforting and empowering us to His glory.
- iii. Which means he didn't leave us when it's hard

Isaiah 58:11 "And the LORD will guide you continually and satisfy your desire in scorched places and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail"

- 2. Application
 - (1) Because regret is a bi-product of limited space.
 - (2) You don't have to freak out about where to be, who to be with and wasting time and space.
 - (3) Instead, time and space are given to us to steward.
 - (4) The omnipresence of God should serve to remind us that we cannot hide from God when we have sinned, yet we can return to God in repentance and faith without even having to move.

#3 - YOU'RE NOT OMNIPOTENT, SO TRUST JESUS (v9b,11b,14b)

Key Text: "lorem ipsum"

I. What Is Omnipotence?

- 1. Exposition
 - (1) Their authority was limited by their tenure. They were only given so much control. Limited.
 - (2) Omnipotent (all-powerful)
 - i. Omni all
 - ii. potens (potent) to have power
- 2. Illustration
 - (1) President is limited by his tenure (8 years max)
- 3. Application

Isaiah 66:1: "Thus says the LORD: "Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool; what is the house that you would build for me, and what is the place of my rest?"

- (1) God has power over salvation.
 - i. Over eternal things outside our control
 - ii. 1 Cor. 15 He has power over death...and He he has power over sin. So only by His power can we be saved from either.
 - iii. 1 Cor. 6:14 His power raised Jesus, same power will raise us
- (2) God has power over creation.
 - i. Over everyday things outside our control
 - ii. Psalm 8 He is holding the moon and star in its place
 - iii. Job 33:4 While at the same time sustaining the oxygen you breathe
 - iv. Psalm 47:8 The God that is sovereign over all rulers and nations
 - v. Prov. 16:1-4 Is sovereign over your plans and pains

II. Why Is It Important?

- 1. Exposition Psalm 139:13-22
- 2. Application
 - (1) Because anger is a bi-product of limited power.
 - (2) You don't have to freak out about what you can't control or what you don't have power over.
 - (3) Instead, power and control are given to us to steward.
 - (4) Ryrie explains, "When faced with those inexplicable circumstances in life we invariably take refuge and find solace in the omniscience of God. Not only does He know what actually happened, but He knows what might have happened. He always knows what ultimate good and glory will come from events which we cannot understand."

I. The Point of Our Limitations

Psalm 139:23-24

- 1. He knows all things (Col. 1:16)
 - (1) "visible and invisible"
 - (2) The most important thing you can know is the Gospel

Rev. 12:12: "...that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, to reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ..."

- (3) Trust the omniscience of God in all other things.
- 2. He is before all things (Col. 1:17)

(1) As a result, wherever you're at and however much time you have left...be present with Jesus.

1. What Are The Real Problems?
