What Launch Timers Need

1. Our Unwavering Prayers

Scripture: Colossians 1:9-10 (NIV) We have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way.

✓ Pray for Godly relationships

Proverbs 13:20 (NLT) Walk with the wise and become wise; associate with fools and get in trouble.

✓ Pray for protection

Psalm 91:9-11 (NLT) If you make the Lord your refuge, if you make the Most High your shelter, no evil will conquer you; no plague will come near your home. For he will order his angels to protect you wherever you go.

✓ Pray for their relationship with God

Philippians 1:6 (NLT) And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns.

2. Our Unending Patience

Scripture: Galatians 6:9 (NIV) Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

Proverbs 16:3 (NLT) Commit your actions to the Lord, and your plans will succeed.

3. Our Unconditional Love

Scripture: Luke 15:13 (NLT) "A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and moved to a distant land, and there he wasted all his money in wild living.
