CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1) Thinking about this week, what is something you are thankful for or something you would like prayer for?
- 2) Read the passage and reflect on the sermon from Sunday. God's love is shown in action (He gave) rather than emotion. What does this tell us about the nature of love?
- 3) Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-8. Which aspect of love feels most challenging to live out in everyday life?
- 4) John 3:19–21 suggests that love sometimes exposes things in us. What might prevent us from fully loving others?
- 5) Are there people in your ordinary life that you have failed to intentionally love lately? Take a moment to ask God: "Who is one person You want me to show intentional love to this week?"
- 6) How can we (the church family) make love more visible together than we can individually?
- 7) How can this group pray for one another to live out love in ordinary, tangible ways this week?
