## Daniel 2:1-36 SA221204

## "World Kingdoms Revealed - Part I"

- 1. If you want to have a good grasp on Biblical prophecy, you must have a good grasp on Daniel Chapter 2.
  - **In** this one chapter, the history of the world is unfolded all the way until the end.
- 2. Last time, we left off with God having blessed and promoted Daniel and his friends due to their faith and faithfulness to Him.
  - **This** week, we will see God's blessing continue through supernatural dreams and visions.
- 3. This is a good time to point out that God DOES speak through visions and dreams even still today.
  - But if we don't understand some basics of interpretation, we are open to deception and being misled in this area.
- 4. What do I mean?
  - God speaks through dreams but not ALL dreams.
  - **Some** dreams are simply restless sleep.

- 5. And even when He speaks through dreams, you can't lay it out as a science that comes with an interpretation chart in which God uses all the same symbols and images to always mean the same thing.
  - God is a God of variety, and you must be in tune with His voice and Spirit to gain any interpretation.
- 6. I say this because there are those who actually write books about what each symbol/image means in a dream, and they try to use that to interpret each dream by their chart.
  - **The** problem is God doesn't use a "chart," and God's imagery in dreams is not consistent.
  - **Meaning** this method is not only inaccurate, but it can also lead well-meaning Christians down the wrong road.
- 7. For example, in Joseph's first dream wheat represented his brothers, but in a later dream the stars did.
  - **Then** in a different dream, wheat represented a famine, but the cows did as well.
  - **So,** as you see it is not always consistent. Books with dream chart interpretations are flawed from the get go.

- 8. So how do we know if a dream is from God?
  - **Firstly,** I think you can know simply in your spirit and the impact it has on your life.
  - **Secondly,** it will always line up with Scripture.
  - **And** thirdly, we see in Scripture God always confirms visions or dreams by giving a second or third confirmation.
- 9. For example, Nebuchadnezzar's, Joseph's, and Daniel's multiple dreams.
  - **Not** to mention Peter's three confirmations with the sheet dropping in Acts.
- 10. Today, we will see all of these elements in play when it comes to Nebuchadnezzar's dreams and Daniel's interpretation that God gives him.
  - That is, we will see that it so bothered
     Nebuchadnezzar that he simply KNEW this
     was something more than a late-night
     snack.
  - Secondly, we will see that Daniel recognized it was Scripture or God revealing the future.
  - **And** lastly, we will see he had more than one dream confirming it was God.

- **v.2** 1. Notice these dreams so bothered him that he called all his "so-called" dream interpreters or "spiritual" people to help him solve it.
  - But as we are going to see, they are of no help and have no ability to help him figure it out.

## 2. Why?

- **Because** while they were "spiritual," they weren't of "God's Spirit" which means they had no ability to interpret it.
- **v.4** 1. First note it says they answered him in Aramaic.
  - **From** Daniel verses **2:4-7:8** we see the language change from Hebrew to Aramaic.
  - Why?
  - 2. Because it is in these chapters and verses that God deals with the future of the "gentile" world.
    - And even as God meets everyone right where they are, speaking their own language in their hearts, He quite literally does so here.
  - 3. Notice they say, "tell us the dream and we will give the interpretation."
    - **This** was reasonable to them as they had their "dream interpretation" method like some do today.

- 4. But the King wasn't having it.
  - He wanted them to PROVE they had a greater supernatural connection.
- **v.6** 1. Remember, Nebuchadnezzar was vicious and to be feared.
  - And notice that he gave them two requirements.
  - 2. Not only did they have to tell what the dream meant, they had to interpret it without hearing what it was!
    - The next time someone says they can interpret your dreams ask them to tell you what it was first!
- **v.15** 1. This whole interaction shows just how favored Daniel was to the Kingdom.
  - **The** decision had been made and the killing had begun, but Daniel was able to reason with the King's executioner.
  - 2. Notice first it says Daniel answered with counsel and wisdom.
    - Meaning he had time to hear about what was happening, then seek counsel and wisdom from God and probably from Shadrach, Meshack, and Abednego.

- And this just accentuates how important it is that we get counsel and wisdom from God AND other godly counselors before we make big discissions.
- 3. And Daniel's first question is, why is this action so "urgent?"
  - **In** other words, must everyone simply be killed without any further discussion from the King's other counselors?
  - Which again is reasonable, but we have to remember that Nebuchadnezzar is not reasonable!
- 4. Then Arioch tells Daniel what's happening, and he realizes the problem they face.
  - **But** notice again he makes an appeal to his authority like we talked about last week.
- **v.16** 1. Notice what a bold request this was of the King.
  - **He** was irrational and had already made up his mind, so he could have just ordered Daniel killed on the spot.
  - 2. However, once again we see God's favor on Daniel.
    - And God's favor will always be on the righteous.

- **v.18** 1. As we noted earlier, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego probably already knew the King was killing the wise men.
  - But now they were told why.
  - 2. And notice the first thing they did was take it to the Lord.
    - What wisdom!
  - 3. Rather than give in to fear and panic they run to God
    - And what a great life lesson for us.
  - 4. While others who were troubled took their problems to bed, Daniel and his friends took their problems to God.
    - **And** that is often the difference between those who rise and those who sink.
    - Even among believers.
  - 5. And notice the result of them seeking God for answers and help.
    - **The** secret was revealed.
- **v.19** 1. Now we don't know if Daniel was awake or asleep for this night vision, but you can imagine what happened once it took place.
  - **The** excitement among them all must have been overwhelming!
  - 2. And notice he "blessed the God of heaven."
    - No kidding! Their lives were just spared!

- 3. This is a great example of true heartfelt praise.
  - It always comes as a natural result and response for what He has done.
- **v.21** Notice Daniel points out that it is GOD who controls all times and seasons of life.
  - **We** will see later in the prophecies of Daniel that Satan, trying to be God in the latter days, will try to change "times and law."
  - But Daniel points out it is GOD alone who can do this and is over all things.
- **v.24** Daniel's heart "Don't kill the wise men of Babylon."
  - **Even** though they were wicked, false teachers of false gods, his heart was for them to be saved as well.
  - Salvation is for all.
- **v.28** 1. Imagine the anticipation of Nebuchadnezzar as he sits forward on his throne.
  - And now notice his humility and how he gives God ALL the glory.
  - 2. First, he says, "I can't reveal it but there is a God in heaven who can."
    - And second, he tells him what it concerns:
      The latter days, which refers to the time

right before the Lord's return to rule the earth.

- v.29 Notice Daniel didn't just tell him the dreams.
  - **He** let him know what he was "thinking" even before the dreams took place!
- **v.30** Notice he says for "our" sakes God has revealed this.
  - **That is,** he also acknowledges the input of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego as prayer partners seeking God with Him.
