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Israeli prime minister blasts 'moral cowards' in fiery speech after UN walkout | Foxnews.com

Benjamin Netanyahu fired back at a mass walkout during his UN General Assembly speech in New York, calling departing delegates "moral cowards."

A mass walkout of delegates before Israeli Prime Minister [Benjamin Netanyahu](#)'s address to the United Nations General Assembly prompted a fiery response from the Israeli leader.

As Netanyahu took the stage, dozens of delegates from across the globe could be seen streaming out of the chamber in New York City. Chants of protest could also be heard in the hall as the [U.N. president](#) called the assembly to order.

After taking the stage, Netanyahu said, "Before I begin, just a quick announcement, if there are any other moral cowards who haven't yet left this hall, please do so now," as cheers erupted from the remaining delegates in the chamber.

The Israeli leader did not let up for the rest of his address. He began by laying out what he described as the stakes of [the conflict in Iran](#). He proclaimed that "devastating Iran's nuclear facilities was hard, it was very hard to do, but for me, it was one of the easiest decisions I've ever had to make as prime minister. Because if we hadn't done it, we'd all be dead."

"Now, you want to hear the ultimate irony?" he continued. "In defending itself, Israel is also defending many of the countries whose delegates just left this hall. In fact, I want you to know that many of the leaders even thanked us privately for taking out Iran's nukes."

"It's hard to imagine more mind blowing hypocrisy, but that's exactly what it is," said Netanyahu.

The protests came as conflict in the [Middle East](#) continued and Israel faced criticism over its actions in the region. Netanyahu's address drew protests from delegates inside the U.N. chamber and demonstrators outside the building, including Hollywood celebrities Elliot Page and Susan Sarandon.

Despite the protests, the prime minister delivered a defiant message, telling critics, "You don't know what you're talking about."

He cast Israel's fight as one for its own survival and the survival of all the world's nations against "barbarians."

"For the past three years, our heroic soldiers have fought day in and day out in a seven front war. Do you know any other country the size of New Jersey capable of fighting a seven front war? And for three years, seven fronts Hamas, Hezbollah, the Houthis, Iran, militias in Iraq, militias in Syria, Palestinian terrorists in Judea, Samaria, they all ganged up on us to wipe us off the face of the earth, they failed. Because instead of collapsing, we delivered crippling blows to all of them, with our great American friends."

"To the protesters outside, to the hypocritical delegates who left this hall. I ask, 'Where were you when the Iranian tyrants butchered and maimed tens of thousands of unarmed Iranian civilians? When they butchered and maimed thousands of their own people? Where were you? Did you organize mass rallies, hunger strikes? Did you protest outside the Iranian mission to the UN? Did you speak out for that matter, for Christians persecuted in Iran and throughout the Middle East?' No, no, you didn't, because you're phony human rights protesters," he said.

He also thanked President Donald Trump for ordering U.S. action against Iran.

"In this battle against the barbarians, we've had no greater partner than President Trump," said Netanyahu. "I thank him. I thank him for his bold leadership. He boldly confronted an enormous danger to America, Israel and the world."

"He understood that if left unchallenged, the fanatic ayatollahs who chant, 'Death to America, death to Israel,' would eventually carry out their mad fantasies. So, Israel and America acted together not only to protect ourselves, but to save civilization," he said.

Netanyahu also criticized detractors in what he called "the eighth front in this war," which he said is "the war for truth." He said that this "war" is "waged in the world's media and most perniciously, in social media."

Turning to criticism from U.S. figures, Netanyahu called out New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani, a socialist, whom he called "anti-semitic," as well as influencer Hasan Piker. Addressing Mamdani directly, Netanyahu said, "Mr. Mamdani, you try to stop me from coming here. You tried to silence me. Well, you can't silence me. You can't silence the truth."

Russian document reveals sweeping Iran plan spanning nuclear, finance and aviation | Foxnews.com

A nonpublic Russian roadmap details plans for alternative financial channels, nuclear cooperation and transport routes toward the Persian Gulf with Iran.

EXCLUSIVE: A nonpublic Russian government document obtained and reviewed by Fox News Digital reveals how Moscow sought to deepen its relationship with Iran far beyond conventional trade — laying out plans for alternative financial channels, nuclear cooperation, Iranian production of Russian aircraft components, major energy projects and new transportation routes stretching toward the Persian Gulf.

The 44-page Russian-language document, titled "Plan for Cooperation Between the Russian Federation and the Islamic Republic of Iran for 2024-2026," is marked "For official use" and was approved on the Russian side on Sept. 2, 2024. It assigns ministries, agencies and state companies responsibility for projects and sets deadlines extending through the end of 2026.

The document predates the current war involving Iran and the United States by well over a year, meaning it does not establish which projects remain active or how the conflict may have altered Moscow's plans.

But an independent review of the Russian-language document, along with subsequent public reporting, shows that a number of initiatives described in the roadmap later advanced or materialized.

Keti Korkiya, a research analyst with the Foundation for Defense of Democracies' Russia program, reviewed the document for Fox News Digital and said its significance lies less in any single project than in the architecture Moscow was trying to build around the relationship.

"The roadmap is not revelatory: people paying close attention to the relationship between Russia and Iran will see many collaborations between the two countries that have been public for years," Korkiya said in written analysis provided to Fox News Digital.

"What is more revealing is the architecture of the relationship Moscow is trying to build," she said, pointing to financial mechanisms, transportation routes, energy investment and aviation cooperation as different ways of reducing vulnerabilities created by sanctions and Western economic pressure.

"These are nonpublic high-level documents that illustrate the comprehensive cooperation between Russia and Iran," a European intelligence source who reviewed the material told Fox News Digital.

"It is also strategic, sensitive and highly politicized, focusing on areas like nuclear programs, energy trade and financial transactions that aim to evade the [U.S. sanctions](#)," the source said.

A U.S. official, responding on background to questions from Fox News Digital about the financial provisions, said [U.S. sanctions](#) have "severely isolated Russia and Iran from the international financial system," adding that efforts by the two countries to develop alternative financial channels and other sanctions-evasion schemes were therefore "not surprising."

The official said Washington closely tracks attempts by sanctioned jurisdictions to develop alternative cross-border payment mechanisms and would seek to disrupt those that facilitate [sanctions evasion](#) or illicit finance.

The Russian document itself does not use the phrase "sanctions evasion." Instead, it repeatedly calls for increased use of national currencies, independent financial channels and measures to counter what Moscow describes as "unilateral restrictive measures."

BUILDING FINANCIAL CHANNELS OUTSIDE WESTERN SYSTEMS

Some of the clearest provisions concern how Russia and Iran intended to move money.

The plan set a target of increasing the share of bilateral trade conducted in national currencies from 68% in 2024 to 71% by 2026, while also seeking to expand correspondent accounts denominated in national currencies.

More ambitiously, the roadmap calls for the Bank of Russia and the Central Bank of Iran to develop the use of central bank digital currencies for cross-border settlements.

Another provision calls for "ensuring the use of independent systems for transmitting financial messages," including connecting financial institutions to independent channels for exchanging financial information.

The document does not identify which messaging system would be used or explicitly state that the goal was to bypass SWIFT or U.S. financial controls.

But some of that financial integration later became public.

In February 2025, Russian Deputy Prime Minister Alexei Overchuk said Russia and Iran had "practically completely" shifted bilateral settlements into national currencies using their own systems for transmitting financial and banking messages. Interfax, a Russian news agency, reported that the effort was part of a broader push toward independent payment infrastructure between the two countries.

Iran's ambassador to Russia also said in February 2025 that Tehran and Moscow no longer needed SWIFT for bilateral banking relations and were using their own confidential bank-messaging systems. He said the initial phase of linking Iran's Shetab payment network with Russia's Mir system had begun the previous year.

Korkiya said the significance of those measures is cumulative.

"Individually, none of these initiatives is transformative," she wrote. "Collectively, however, they amount to an attempt to remove single points of vulnerability and build redundancy into the Russia-Iran economic relationship."

The financial effort is paired with a political one.

The roadmap calls for Russia and Iran to [coordinate through BRICS](#) and other international institutions against "unilateral trade restrictions," while another provision proposes studying ways to counter "unilateral restrictive measures" and their impact on global markets.

Korkiya said that goes beyond simply finding workarounds.

"Especially interesting is that the roadmap also goes beyond practical sanctions workarounds and includes an effort to build an intellectual and diplomatic campaign against sanctions themselves," she wrote, citing plans for expert communities, discussion platforms and an international forum focused on unilateral restrictions.

A U.S. official told Fox News Digital that financial institutions and intermediaries enabling sanctions evasion expose themselves to "significant sanctions risks," adding that Washington would continue working with partners to "identify, expose and disrupt these networks wherever they emerge."

The official also pushed back on the idea that [alternative Russia-Iran systems](#) could displace Western financial infrastructure.

"Russia and Iran can try to build alternative financial channels, but they cannot replicate the reach, liquidity or trust of the U.S. dollar and the international financial system," the official said. "Their efforts will not weaken the effectiveness of [U.S. sanctions](#)."

ROSATOM AND IRAN'S NUCLEAR SECTOR

The financial architecture sits alongside another strategically sensitive pillar of the relationship: [civilian nuclear energy](#).

The plan assigns Russia's state nuclear corporation Rosatom continued responsibility at Iran's [Bushehr nuclear power plant](#), including fuel and maintenance support for Unit 1 and continuing construction work associated with Units 2 and 3.

The cooperation did not remain solely on paper.

On Sept. 2, 2026, [Rosatom said](#) Russian specialists had begun returning to Bushehr, that Unit 1 was preparing for scheduled maintenance and partial fuel replacement, and that nuclear fuel had already been delivered to the site. Rosatom also said work was continuing on the plant and that additional Russian specialists were expected to arrive.

Korkiya noted that the Bushehr Units 2 and 3 project predates the 2024 roadmap, meaning the document did not originate that cooperation but rather incorporated an existing strategic project into the broader Russia-Iran framework.

"Such strategies and protocols confirm that Russia and Iran are closely aligned countries, and Russia almost certainly continues and aims to increase its current cooperation with Iran also in 2026," the European intelligence source said.

Fox News Digital sought comment from Rosatom on the document and the current status of its work in Iran.

ENERGY PROJECTS — WITH SOME FINANCING KEPT CONFIDENTIAL

The roadmap also identifies specific [Iranian oil and gas fields](#) where Moscow sought a role.

It names Shadegan, Kish and North Pars, assigning Russia's Energy Ministry and unspecified "interested Russian companies" responsibility for advancing the projects.

Those companies are not named in the roadmap. For several projects, the financing column is marked "Confidential."

There is evidence that at least one of the named projects advanced.

[Interfax reported](#) on Feb. 13, 2026, that Russian state-owned ZN-Vostok was developing Iran's Shadegan oil field, while Iranian officials said Tehran hoped to expand Russian investment across additional oil and gas projects.

The roadmap sets milestones for Shadegan through the end of 2025, while work involving Kish and North Pars runs into 2026 and includes legal, commercial and project-analysis work.

That pattern appears repeatedly through the document: ministries, deadlines and strategic objectives are spelled out, while some of the participating companies or financing arrangements remain undisclosed.

RUSSIAN AIRCRAFT PARTS — MADE IN IRAN?

One of the more unusual provisions goes beyond ordinary trade.

The roadmap calls for Russia to help establish production in Iran of individual parts and assemblies for Russian aircraft.

Russian authorities were instructed to determine which aircraft parts could be repaired or manufactured in Iran, identify Iranian companies capable of producing them, certify selected sites through Russia's aviation regulator Rosaviatsiya and conclude a localization agreement.

The roadmap set a March 31, 2026, deadline for an agreement on localized production and a Dec. 31, 2026, target for launching prototype production.

Public evidence does show that aviation cooperation advanced in the related area of aircraft maintenance.

In February 2025, [Rosaviatsiya's chief said](#) three Iranian companies had been approved to perform maintenance and airworthiness work on Russian-operated aircraft after an Aeroflot Airbus A330 underwent maintenance in Tehran.

The Russian government also publicly discussed deeper aviation-industrial cooperation with Iran that month, including aircraft manufacturing and joint work on jet engines for passenger aircraft.

But Fox News Digital has not independently verified that the more ambitious provision in the roadmap — manufacturing Russian aircraft components inside Iran — was implemented.

A TRADE ROUTE SOUTH

The document also lays out an effort to strengthen the physical transportation network linking Russia and Iran.

It calls for work on a proposed railway built to Russia's 1,520-millimeter track gauge, stretching from Iran's border with Azerbaijan toward [Iranian ports on the Persian Gulf](#).

The proposal remained in the planning and negotiation stage in the roadmap.

Separately, Moscow sought to advance the Rasht-Astara railway, a roughly 162-kilometer missing link in the [International North-South Transport Corridor](#).

That project subsequently moved beyond the purely conceptual stage.

Russia and Iran formally launched engineering surveys for the railway in May 2025, according to Russia's Transport Ministry.

Korkiya said the project had still not reached full construction by late summer 2026, with Russian and Iranian officials continuing to work on the implementation and construction arrangements. She also identified another provision: Iranian investment in port infrastructure in Astrakhan, Russia.

The roadmap calls for a terminal there using Iranian investment, along with warehouses, a logistics park and grain and vegetable-oil facilities. Korkiya found that an Iranian-owned company later operated a terminal in Astrakhan with a railway spur and was building grain and vegetable-oil storage facilities that closely tracked the roadmap's description, although the document does not identify that company by name and the match cannot be definitively established.

Taken together, the transport provisions point to an effort to build physical trade routes that are less dependent on traditional European corridors.

MEDIA, TECHNOLOGY AND "INFORMATION SECURITY"

The roadmap reaches well beyond finance and heavy industry.

It calls for content exchange, journalist training and joint media production, including at least two joint projects and 'professional training' for Iranian journalists.

It also calls for Russian technology companies to secure at least two contracts in Iran involving information and communications technology, including "information security," telecommunications and the video-game industry.

A PUTIN FAMILY CONNECTION AT THE TOP

The official overseeing the Russian side of the relationship also has a direct connection to President Vladimir Putin's extended family.

Russian Energy Minister Sergei Tsivilev chairs the Russian side of the Permanent Russian-Iranian Commission on Trade and Economic Cooperation.

Tsivilev is married to Anna Tsivileva, a Russian deputy defense minister and the daughter of Putin's late cousin, Reuters reported when Putin appointed her to the Defense Ministry in June 2024.

The European intelligence source argued that the connection reflects the political importance Moscow attaches to Iran.

"It should be emphasized that on Russia's part, the economic cooperation with Iran is coordinated and managed by a representative of Vladimir Putin's extended family," the source said.

"This indicates that the Iranian matter is not just one of many bureaucratic issues in the agenda of the Russian government. But it holds significant value for the interest of the Vladimir Putin regime."

"What is also notable is the degree of state coordination and institutionalization behind this effort," she said, pointing to the involvement of central banks, ministries, regulators and state companies, as well as formal deadlines and confidential financing in some projects.

"That suggests Moscow is trying to turn what could otherwise remain a politically convenient partnership into something more durable and bureaucratically embedded," Korkiya said.

Russian and Iranian officials did not respond to multiple requests for comment from Fox News Digital. Fox News Digital also sought comment from Rosatom and from Russian officials responsible for Moscow's participation in BRICS.

Vance: US cannot let its Mideast foreign policy be 'subservient to Israel' | The Times of Israel.com

US vice president says allies sometimes disagree, Trump has shown he's ready to 'part ways' with Netanyahu for sake of American interests; envoy Huckabee insists relationship 'solid'

US Vice President JD Vance said Tuesday that Washington can't let its policies in the Middle East be "subservient" to those of Israel, and must place its own interests first.

Speaking to a conference organized by the All-In Podcast, Vance said of US-Israel ties: "Obviously Israel has been an important partner when it comes to military technology, when it comes to intelligence sharing, but also sometimes the United States doesn't... agree with Israel."

He said that US President Donald Trump is ready to place his country first if need be.

"I think that more than frankly any president in the last 40 years, he has shown a willingness to actually part ways with Bibi Netanyahu when he feels like the interests of the American people are different from the interests of the government of Israel," Vance said, using Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's nickname.

"Donald Trump is the one president of the last 40 years who's been willing to say 'You know what, yeah Bibi's a good partner, but also Bibi and I have a different opinion on this,' or 'Bibi's wrong about this,' or maybe 'Bibi's right about this from the perspective of Israel, but the American people need us to go in a different direction.'"

Vance argued that "rooting this relationship, like all relationships, in America's interest is the way to actually have a rational conversation here."

The vice president said this was true for NATO as well.

"[We have] a lot of important relationships, a lot of important partnerships in NATO, but that doesn't mean we're gonna completely make our European foreign policy subservient to NATO, in the same way that we cannot let our Middle Eastern foreign policy be subservient to the State of Israel," Vance said.

"We're gonna work with people when we work with them, we're gonna disagree when we disagree. And we're gonna pursue America's interests. That's the only way to have a rational foreign policy."

Meanwhile, US Ambassador to Israel Mike Huckabee told the Ynet outlet in an interview published Wednesday that the relationship between Trump and Netanyahu “is still strong and solid.”

Israel and the US, he asserted, “work incredibly close together, more than most people will ever, ever understand.”

Asked about the drop in support for Israel in the US, the envoy put it down to “misinformation.”

“I think most of it is misinformation, because I would ask myself, what are they critical of?” he said.

The war against Iran is in America’s interest, he noted, not just Israel’s.

“When we are partnering against Iran, we’re not defending Israel, we’re defending the United States,” he said, recalling that for decades Tehran has been saying, “Death to America.”

“Israel is maybe the appetizer, but we’re the entree,” he said.

Huckabee rejected the claim that Israel pushed Trump into the war with Iran, which began with joint Israel-US strikes on February 28 aimed at degrading the Iranian regime’s military capabilities, distancing threats posed by Iran — including its nuclear and ballistic missile programs — and “creating the conditions” for the Iranian people to topple the regime, the military and other Israeli leaders have said.

“He did it from his own volition,” Huckabee said of Trump.

Asked if America would go to war with Iran or some other power to defend Israel against an existential threat, Huckabee said only, “If it was in America’s best interest, the president would act. But that’s what he’s required to do.”

Huckabee also addressed extremist settler violence in the West Bank, which he has [previously condemned](#). He clarified that, in his view, the extremists do not represent the settler community as a whole.

“I have never attributed all of these actions to settlers,” he said. “In fact, I say they’re not settlers, they’re unsettlers.”

[Swing state mayor sued as city's Muslim holiday displays ignite religious-favoritism fight | Foxnews.com](#)

A federal lawsuit filed Thursday alleges the city of [Dearborn](#) spent thousands of taxpayer dollars on public displays celebrating Muslim holidays while ignoring a Christian resident's repeated requests for Easter and Passover recognition.

Margot Cleveland, a journalist with The Federalist, filed a civil rights lawsuit with the American Freedom Law Center (AFLC) against the city of Dearborn and Democratic Mayor Abdullah Hammoud, alleging the city violated her First and Fourteenth Amendment rights, including protections involving religious establishment, free speech and equal protection.

"The City of Dearborn spent taxpayer money to light up its streets and parks for Ramadan while stonewalling a resident who simply asked that Easter, Passover, and other Christian and Jewish holy days be treated the same way," Robert J. Muise, AFLC co-founder and senior counsel, said in a statement. "That is a straightforward Establishment Clause violation, and the retaliation our client faced for speaking up about it only compounds the constitutional harm."

Dearborn is home to one of the largest Arab American communities in the country. The city had 109,976 residents in the 2020 Census, and 54.5% reported Middle Eastern or North African ancestry. Michigan Avenue, the city's main thoroughfare, is lined with businesses featuring Arabic-script signs and Middle Eastern cuisine. There are ten mosques within the city limits, according to an [online directory](#).

Hammoud was first elected mayor in November 2021, becoming the first Muslim and Arab American to lead the city of Dearborn.

"What makes this case especially troubling is that City officials, up to and including the Mayor, responded to a citizen's respectful request for equal treatment with silence, stonewalling, and outright hostility — including the Mayor's own words telling a Christian resident he is 'not welcome' in his own city," David Yerushalmi, an attorney on the case, said. "Our client is simply asking the City to treat Christians and Jews as equal citizens."

Lawyers for Cleveland pointed to a September exchange between Hammoud and [Christian pastor Ted Barham](#) as evidence of what they allege is the city's hostility toward Christians. Barham had raised concerns during a City Council meeting over the city's decision to rename a street after Usama Siblani, publisher of The Arab American News, who has made statements expressing [support for Hezbollah](#).

In the exchange, Hammoud called Barham a "bigot" and an "Islamophobe."

"And although you live here, I want you to know as mayor, you are not welcome here," Hammoud told the Christian pastor. "And the day you move out of the city will be the day that I launch a parade celebrating the fact that you moved out of the city... because you are not somebody who believes in coexistence."

But Cleveland's lawsuit alleges that city leaders ignored her requests for the city to also recognize [Christian and Jewish holidays](#) after she began seeing "Ramadan Kareem" banners and large crescent moons displayed across the city in spring 2025. A FOIA request revealed that the city had spent \$1,500 on Ramadan banners and \$5,000 on the crescent-moon display. The Dearborn Police Department was also selling Ramadan-themed T-shirts.

In emails to the city, Cleveland said she did not want the city to stop celebrating Muslim holidays but wanted equal recognition for Christian and Jewish holy days.

"I much prefer to ensure equality of faith traditions, as opposed to a challenge to the display," Cleveland wrote in an email.

Not only did the city allegedly ignore Cleveland's requests, but in February 2026, it expanded its Ramadan displays, commissioning crescent-and-star lights that were displayed on municipal streetlights across the city.

"This initiative reflects who we are as a city," Hammoud said in a statement.

Tensions between Cleveland and city officials continued in April, when Cleveland alleges she was told she could attend a community meeting as a resident but not as a journalist. The lawsuit also alleges Hammoud made what it describes as a "snide comment" about residents who criticize the city on social media to monetize their posts.

The lawsuit also alleges that in February 2026, the city expanded its Ramadan displays, commissioning crescent-and-star lights for municipal streetlights across the city.

Cleveland pushed back, according to the lawsuit, saying she was simply "a concerned resident who was ignored when I asked for the City to treat Christians and Jews equally."

"Despite the repeated requests, they treated her as if she were an outsider and not a full member of the political community," Muise told Fox News Digital.

The lawsuit comes during Michigan's closely watched 2026 U.S. Senate race, with Democratic nominee [Abdul El-Sayed](#), who is Muslim and the son of Egyptian immigrants, facing Republican nominee Mike Rogers for the state's open Senate seat. Religion and antisemitism have become points of dispute in the race, with Republicans and some Democrats criticizing El-Sayed over his association with streamer Hasan Piker, who said the U.S. was worse than al Qaeda "pound for pound, as far as the number of deaths," while arguing that U.S. military actions that kill civilians can amount to acts of terror.

‘Israel cannot survive with no friends’: Pro-Israel US rep. says polls showing declining support for Jewish state should be translated to Hebrew | The Times of Israel.com

Pro-Israel US Rep. Brad Sherman (D-Calif.) calls for recent polls showing declining support for Israel among Americans to be translated into Hebrew, saying that most Israelis “don’t realize what is at stake.”

The poll was first published by CNN in July but has been circulating online again in recent days.

The poll shows that in between March and July 2026, a significant decline in how people view Israel was recorded across multiple polls. An IPSOS poll found that favorability was down by 10 points since March, while a Fox News poll put that number at -11. The Marquette Law School Poll put that drop at 20 points, and a Pew Research poll found that Israel’s favorability had dropped by 23 points since March.

“We’re not just talking about the Democratic base anymore, we’re talking about the general electorate as well. The general electorate has turned against Israel,” CNN’s Harry Enten says in the July report. “This is not just a left issue; this is an American issue when it comes to opinions on Israel.”

Sherman shares a clip on X of the CNN report on the findings, and suggests that “every Israeli official and voter” should watch it, “and it needs to be translated into Hebrew.”

He adds that he spoke earlier this week with Israel’s ambassador to the US, Yechiel Leiter, saying that “I don’t think he or the majority of Israelis realize what is at stake,” if the US-Israeli relationship continues to decline.

“It’s not just \$3.8 billion of traditional annual aid. It’s access to US weapons and diplomatic support,” writes Sherman.

Outlining what he believes to be the problem, Sherman says “Israel has been unwilling to take even a few steps to improve its image around the world.”

“They don’t fund their foreign ministry,” he claims.

He also cites far-right National Security Minister Itamar Ben Gvir as a cause for the declining support, saying his presence in the cabinet “poses an existential threat,” as well as unchecked settler violence against Palestinians.

“Israel cannot survive with no friends in the world,” adds Sherman.

BRICS leaders including China, Russia and India concluded a second and final day of talks in New Delhi on Sunday, discussing "inclusive global growth", after reaching a rare agreement calling for calm in the Middle East.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi called for "cooperation" within the bloc, which he has said represents "50 percent of the world's population, 40 percent of global GDP and more than 25 percent of global trade".

"The power of BRICS lies in our diversity and cooperation," Modi told leaders, including Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin, on the final day of talks.

BRICS was created in 2009 as a forum for major emerging economies seeking greater influence in institutions dominated by Western powers. The group is seeking to bolster its global influence and address conflict, trade turbulence and energy security.

"We have tried to push inclusive global growth," Modi said.

"We may be rooted in different realities, but together we rise through cooperation and blossom for humanity," he said.

Putin said the bloc was working to create a "new, more just, multipolar world order".

Xi said that a "world without rules is like an intersection without traffic lights; chaos and disorder are inevitable".

- 'Maximum restraint' -

The first day of the summit on Saturday was dominated by the conflict in the Middle East.

BRICS foreign ministers had failed to agree on a joint statement in New Delhi in May, with Iran, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates divided over the war that began with US-Israeli strikes on February 28.

However, leaders -- who also included Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian -- issued a statement after intense diplomatic efforts by host India.

"We express deep concern over the continued escalation of tensions in Middle East/West Asia," the joint statement said, adding that the BRICS countries "call for exercising maximum restraint".

Modi maintains cordial relations with both Iran and US ally Israel, but is also careful to strike a delicate balance in India's ties with Washington.

India has navigated the energy crisis caused by the US-Iran war in part by turning to Russia, despite Moscow's war in Ukraine and pressure from Washington and other Western capitals.

- 'Advancing together' -

Xi's participation in BRICS was also important because it was his first visit to neighbouring India since 2019, and the biggest step yet in a cautious thaw between the nuclear-armed rivals.

His visit came six years after a deadly military clash along the disputed Tibetan border between China and India, with ties gradually improving through restored flights, visas and high-level contacts.

"Although our two countries are different in many respects, they are fully capable of complementing each other's strengths, supporting one another, achieving mutual success and advancing together," Xi said as he met Modi, according to a video released by New Delhi.

The underlying territorial dispute remains unresolved, and both sides retain heavy military deployments along their roughly 3,500-kilometre (2,175-mile) high-altitude border.

India's foreign ministry said in a statement after the meeting that "the two leaders expressed commitment to a fair, reasonable, and mutually acceptable resolution of the boundary question".

Deep mistrust remains, with a widening trade deficit and strategic rivalry complicating ties.

"Both sides should... work hand-in-hand to promote high-quality major financial cooperation, advocate an equal and sustainable global order, and foster an economic globalisation that is open and inclusive," Xi said.

Xi's visit was the target of protests by dozens of Tibetans in New Delhi, exiles like their Buddhist leader, the Dalai Lama, who has lived in India since fleeing a Chinese crackdown in 1959.

Norway considers up to 3 years in prison for trade with Israeli settlements in Judea and Samaria | All Israel News.com

Norwegian Foreign Minister Espen Barth Eide backs a bill criminalizing trade with Israeli communities in Judea, Samaria, and East Jerusalem with prison terms.

Norway is considering legislation that could impose up to three years in prison for trading with Israeli Jewish communities in Judea and Samaria, internationally known as the West Bank, as Oslo continues its increasingly confrontational policy toward Israel.

Norwegian Foreign Minister Espen Barth Eide announced the proposed legislation on Monday, arguing that deteriorating conditions in Judea and Samaria have strengthened the case for the measure. The proposal could potentially go further than a similar British trade measure announced recently, including Israeli neighborhoods in East Jerusalem.

“The arguments [in support of the bill] have only become stronger because the situation in the West Bank has become even worse. In addition, so many other countries are now doing the same thing the government has already proposed through this bill,” Eide [said](#) in an interview with the Norwegian broadcaster *NRK*.

The Israeli Embassy in Oslo condemned the proposed legislation. Norway’s announcement comes after the British government recently imposed trade sanctions against Israeli communities in Judea and Samaria. Israel responded by [closing the British consulate in Jerusalem](#) as tensions between the two countries continued to deteriorate.

Following London’s announcement, Norway joined Canada, France, Finland, Denmark, Sweden, Poland, Ireland and Spain in issuing a joint statement opposing Israeli communities in the disputed territories.

Eide also accused Israel of attempting to silence international criticism by labeling critics as antisemites.

“Israel has become far too accustomed to being able to intimidate Western countries by saying they were antisemites if they criticized Israel for abuses and violations of international law. Now the [protective cover] that Israel has in many ways enjoyed is gone,” Eide argued.

Much of the international community considers Israeli Jewish communities in Judea and Samaria to be “illegal settlements on occupied land.” Israel disputes that position, arguing that the territory has deep Jewish historical and ancestral ties and that its final legal and political status remains disputed.

The Norwegian proposal could potentially go further than the British measure. London has not specified whether Jewish communities in East Jerusalem would be included as settlements, while the Norwegian trade ban reportedly would include Jewish neighborhoods in East Jerusalem that are part of Israel’s capital.

Eide acknowledged that trade between Norway and the Israeli communities in question is limited. “The goods in question include, for example, wine and some agricultural products,” he said.

However, the Norwegian foreign minister argued that the proposed ban is primarily a matter of principle.

“If the largest countries do not stand up for international law, human rights, and international law, then the rest of us will have to do it,” Eide said, likely referring to the United States.

Norway has emerged as one of Israel’s most vocal critics in Europe. In May 2024, Norway joined Spain and Ireland in [unilaterally recognizing a Palestinian state](#), just months after the Hamas Oct. 7 massacre of 1,200 Israelis and the kidnapping of 251 people from southern Israel.

At the time, Eide said, “For more than 30 years, Norway has been one of the strongest advocates for a Palestinian state. Today, when Norway officially recognizes Palestine as a state, is a milestone in the relationship between Norway and Palestine.”

The Israeli government condemned the decision as a *de facto* diplomatic reward for the Oct. 7 massacre, which it described as the largest single-day massacre of Jews since the Holocaust.

Antisemitic and anti-Israel sentiment has also drawn increasing attention in Norway since the Oct. 7 attacks. In May, a Norwegian university professor of Middle Eastern descent [praised the massacre of Israeli civilians](#), including women and children, as the “most beautiful thing this century.”

Norwegian officials have largely rejected accusations of antisemitism, arguing that the country’s policies toward Israel are based on international law and human rights.

Mamdani blasts Netanyahu again: A ‘war criminal’ and ‘architect of a horrific genocide’ | Israel National News.com

New York City Mayor Zohran Mamdani renewed his criticism of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Monday, describing him as a “war criminal” while acknowledging that, despite statements made during his mayoral campaign, he does not have the authority to arrest the Israeli leader.

“When it comes to Benjamin Netanyahu, I have described him as I believe him to be a war criminal and an architect of a horrific genocide of the Palestinian people,” Mamdani told *CNN*’s Christiane Amanpour.

The International Criminal Court (ICC) issued arrest warrants in 2024 for Netanyahu and then-Defense Minister Yoav Gallant, alleging war crimes committed by Israel during its counterterrorism efforts against Hamas in Gaza.

Mamdani had pledged during his campaign that he would instruct the New York Police Department to arrest Netanyahu if the Prime Minister entered the city. In a July interview with *The New York Times*, [he said](#) he was exploring potential means of detaining Netanyahu. However, [he later conceded](#) in a video that the mayor of New York City lacks the legal authority to enforce an ICC arrest warrant and instead urged the federal government to act.

In the interview with Amanpour, Mamdani said, “I do believe that that is something that should be honored, because what we want to see, and we’ve been talking about this today, is a faith in our politics, a faith in accountability.”

With New York preparing for this week's United Nations General Assembly, Mamdani also said he met with The Hague Mayor Jan van Zanen. According to Mamdani, their discussion focused on the importance of the rule of law.

“If the International Criminal Court deems someone worthy of an arrest because of a violation of those laws, then who are we to say that anyone should be above that? And I think very clearly that everyone should be held accountable to it,” Mamdani said.

Netanyahu is scheduled to deliver an address to the UN on Thursday. Multiple demonstrations have been announced ahead of his appearance, but Mamdani [has said](#) he will not take part in the protests despite previously encouraging New Yorkers to take part in such protests.

Jewish life in Germany 'no longer safe,' chancellor warns as far-left wins 'election intifada' in Berlin | All Israel News.com

Die Linke's victory in Berlin's state elections sparks sharp warnings from Israeli officials and Jewish leaders over post-colonial rhetoric and antisemitism.

With Jewish life under fire across the world, two consecutive state election victories by Germany's far-right Alternative für Deutschland (AfD) have justifiably drawn attention.

However, the most serious harm to Jewish life in Germany could well come from last weekend's victory by the far-left Die Linke (The Left) in the capital Berlin. Leaders from across the political spectrum, Jewish community leaders and the Israeli ambassador are sounding the alarm about what they describe as extreme anti-Israeli and antisemitic positions within the party.

Die Linke, the successor of the SED party that led East Germany's dictatorship until reunification in 1990, won the Berlin city-state elections on Sunday with 25.7% of the vote, defeating the traditional largest parties, CDU and SPD, by significant margins.

If Die Linke can convince the center-left SPD and the Green Party to join a coalition, it could rule a unified Berlin for the first time. The city has the largest Jewish community in Germany, with around 50,000 people, which includes thousands of Israeli expats.

The German capital has been at the center of anti-Israel protests since Oct. 7, 2023. The protests have often included clashes with the police and have been dominated by the city's growing Arabic- and Muslim-background population, as well as its large population of left-wing radicals.

The party's campaign explicitly targeted these groups. In a recent example, the candidate Basem Said urged his voters to wage an "election intifada," while accusing the centrist parties of "enforcing the same racist consensus." He continued, "They have suppressed our civil rights, normalized anti-Arab demonization, actively supported the [Israeli] genocide, and voted for arms smuggling to the Israeli regime."

"Vote for the Left. Stand fearlessly for the rights of migrants and the liberation of Palestine," Said urged voters. His campaign slogan is: "For Neukölln. For migration. For Palestine."

The already latently antisemitic Die Linke has seen rapid changes over the past years. “The party has been infiltrated in recent years,” explained Israeli-Arab extremism expert Ahmad Mansour in an interview with *Focus*.

“After the death of George Floyd in the United States in 2020, identity politics became very influential... the white majority society supposedly oppresses all migrants and all Muslims. Then came Hamas’s attack on Israel, and suddenly members began arguing over the issue of Israel. The postcolonial ideology that views Israel as the last colonial project, demonizes it, and regards the Palestinians exclusively as victims is now predominant within the party,” said Mansour.

German Chancellor [Friedrich Merz](#), whose CDU has now been trounced in multiple successive state elections, lamented, “The fact that Jewish life is no longer safe in Germany is the heaviest burden of recent years.”

“The CDU, and I personally, are committed to doing everything possible to ensure that Jewish life in Germany, and here in the capital, Berlin, is safe,” Merz said, vowing to Jewish communities in Berlin and worldwide that what has become possible in Berlin’s streets “is a disgrace for Germany, and I will do everything in my power to bring it under control and push it back.”

Merz also urged moderate left-wing parties not to cooperate with Die Linke. “I very much hope that the SPD in particular, but also the Greens, will give a very clear response here, especially here in Berlin,” Merz added.

Israel’s ambassador to Germany, Ron Prosor, stressed that the party’s performance “must concern anyone who cares about the continued existence of Jewish life in this city. The completely unrestrained antisemitism that has emerged within this party takes on a new political dimension with its rise to become the strongest political force.”

Following an election campaign filled with antisemitic controversies, Prosor noted that “recent incidents at the election-night parties demonstrate this. We are no longer talking about isolated lapses, but about a system. New red lines are being crossed again and again.”

At the victory party, Die Linke lawmaker Ferat Kocak was photographed with Ibrahim Ibrahim, a well-known pro-Palestinian activist and member of the terror group PFLP. According to *Tagesspiegel*, he once described [Yahya Sinwar](#), the slain Hamas mastermind of the Oct. 7 attacks, as a “martyr hero.”

Kocak justified his appearance with Ibrahim by arguing that he didn’t know who he was and distanced himself from “statements praising violence and terrorism.”

But images showed that Issa Remmo, the infamous head of the Berlin-based Lebanese crime family, was at the party as well. Die Linke at first denied any connections, but then chats between Kocak and the crime boss’ son became public. The younger Remmo commented that he and Kocak “fight for our goals together.”

Asked about Israel’s right to exist last year, Kocak said, “People have a right to exist – not states.”

In June, Die Linke party passed a resolution designating Israel’s actions in the Gaza Strip as a “genocide.” In September, a rapper called for “Yalla Yalla Intifada” and “Death to the IDF” at a campaign event.

The performance by rapper “Dahabflex,” who also chanted praise for the terror group PFLP as part of his song “Stop the Genocide,” drew considerable controversy, though apparently not enough to derail the party’s successful campaign.

The party’s lead candidate in Berlin, and possible future mayor, Elif Eralp, subsequently condemned the performance, saying that “calls for violence and the killing of people are absolutely unacceptable” and adding, “Those responsible should have intervened immediately.”

After the election, party co-chair Ines Schwerdtner rejected accusations of antisemitism, arguing that “criticism of the Israeli government and the Israeli military should not be equated with antisemitism.”

“While we want to address the real problem of antisemitism, it must also be possible to criticize the Israeli government and military. These war crimes must be addressed just as much as the very real antisemitism and hatred of Jews in Germany,” she said.

However, president of the Central Council of Jews in Germany, Josef Schuster, responded that the party has no credibility in the fight against Jew hatred: “The fact

that a party on whose campaign stage the death of people was openly demanded emerged as the winner of the election worries me deeply. To date, there have been no personnel or political consequences.”

On the contrary, senior figures have been leaving the party over this issue. In March, the antisemitism commissioner for the German state of Brandenburg resigned, citing an anti-Israel resolution by the party’s youth delegation in Lower Saxony, as well as harassment from within his party.

“It’s no longer possible. And I can’t go on ... without betraying my own convictions,” Büttner wrote in a statement.

“You cannot claim to stand alongside Jewish life while events involving antisemites are being held or defended,” he added.

Gemini hacked three companies in first known breakout by Google's AI | CNN.com

Google's Gemini model accessed the internet and hacked other companies during a test of its cybersecurity capabilities, the first known example of the company's AI systems autonomously committing such an act.

The hacks occurred in May during a cybersecurity test conducted by Irregular, an independent company that conducts cybersecurity evaluations.

During a standard testing evaluation, Gemini found public information online and guessed credentials to access three websites it thought were within the scope of its test, Heather Adkins, Google's vice president of security engineering, said in a statement.

"We ensured the three entities were made aware, and we worked with our training partner on the changes they've now made to their testing processes," Adkins said. "These events highlight the importance of training powerful AI models to act responsibly."

An Irregular spokesperson said the incident involved the same issue that affected other AI labs and that all relevant labs were notified in late July. "All known issues on our end were remedied and resolved weeks ago," the spokesperson said.

Similar incidents linked to Irregular were disclosed by Meta, Anthropic and OpenAI. Meta said in August [the incident](#) did not involve a sandbox escape or sophisticated cyberattack, while Irregular said it was working on best practices for securely conducting AI cybersecurity evaluations.

The incidents have raised questions about the safeguards needed as AI agents gain greater autonomy and access to the internet and computer systems.

In one of the cases, the Gemini model guessed passwords until it gained access to a protected system. In the other two cases, the model found credentials in a public repository that allowed it to then access protected systems, according to the Wall Street Journal, which first reported the news on Friday.

Adkins said that in all three instances, the model ceased its hacking.

Undercover video shows Talarico's longtime Austin church gives new members an 'Inclusive Bible' that strips 'Son of God' and 'Lord' from Scripture.

Texas Democrat Senate candidate James Talarico's longtime Austin church gives new members copies of an "Inclusive Bible" that removes gendered language for God, according to undercover video footage.

The Daily Caller [reported](#) that Rev. Jim Rigby, head pastor at St. Andrew's Presbyterian for more than 35 years and a spiritual mentor to Talarico, told an undercover journalist the church "typically" hands out the translation when people join.

"It's good on the gender stuff," Rigby said in the video. "The more, like, metaphysical stuff, it's not a very good translation, if that makes sense. I think it's really important to have a good translation so you can let go of the stupid stuff."

The footage, recorded in August, shows a new member identified as Larry receiving a copy during a service.

"It's the Bible that we use at this church," an unidentified woman says. "It's been rewritten so that there is only inclusive language and that it doesn't use the gender-fueled language that the King James Version uses."

First published in 2007 by Priests for Equality, the translation bills itself as the "first egalitarian" Bible, [according](#) to the Christian Post. Its translators call "the Lord" a "sexist and classist form" of God's name and replace it with terms like "Most High" and "Sovereign One." Jesus' titles "Son of God" and "Son of Man" are swapped for "Only Begotten," "God's Own," and "Eternally Begotten."

Talarico's ties to St. Andrew's run deep. The Austin Democrat was baptized there, has attended since childhood, and had Rigby marry his parents and deliver the invocation at his Texas House swearing-in.

The church describes itself as "Presbyterian & Progressive" and argues that calling God male is "perhaps the most sexist comment a person can make," Texas Scorecard [reported](#). In separate footage cited by the outlet, minister Babs Miller claimed the "vast majority" of the congregation would identify as "agnostic or atheist."

In a 2021 House debate, Talarico [argued](#) that “God is non-binary,” a remark he later called “cringey” and “deliberately provocative,” and once [described](#) himself as a “Christian who hates Christianity.”

The video surfaces as Talarico [runs](#) against Attorney General Ken Paxton in a race polls show within striking distance.

‘American Idol’ Star Breanna Nix Shares Gospel With 80-Year-Old Lifelong Atheist—and His Response Is Powerful | Crosswalk.com

Christian country singer Breanna Nix witnessed an extraordinary conversion when an 80-year-old lifelong atheist encountered faith at her concert.

While she may no longer be on "American Idol," Breanna Nix is using the platform she gained from being on the popular program to share the gospel and even help lead people to Christ.

In a [post on her Instagram page](#), the Christian country singer, who came in third on the show in 2025, recalled a situation in which an atheist who had attended one of her shows came to know Christ as his personal Lord and Savior.

The man, 80, Nix points out, was a lifelong atheist.

“A couple months back, we were at a concert, and it was actually a country concert, and we were singing a lot of country music,” she recalled. “And I ended up slipping a few Christian songs in there. And at the end of the show, I was in my meet and greet line, and I had quite a few people there.”

However, she added, "There was this one special man who really stood out to me.”

When it was his turn, Nix said the man approached her, "hugged me and started crying.”

Nix soon learned that this man had recently lost his wife and was brought to the show by his daughter, who was trying to get his mind off his wife's recent passing.

But next, something powerful and unexpected happened, something no one could have predicted. He mentioned that while he had been an atheist his entire life, Nix's performance that night changed something in him. It caused him to question what he believed.

“I have been an atheist my whole entire life,” the man told Nix. “I’ve never believed that there was a God or any kind of power. But you have made me start to kind of question, as you were singing, and you’re the first person in my life to ever do that.”

Understanding that he did not have much time left on Earth, this man added that he was interested in giving this "[Jesus](#) thing" a try and wanted to know how long the process would take and what steps he had to take.

Nix took the opening the man gave her and shared with him the most recognizable and most important verse of Scripture: [John 3:16](#).

"And I told him that that was a promise, and all we had to do was believe," she added.

Nix said the man's reaction after she shared the verse that says Christ died for all and that all we have to do is believe in Him will stay with her forever.

"And those tears that were just in his eyes actually started rolling down his cheeks all the way to his chest," said Nix. "And I'll never forget how he grabbed me, and he shook me and he said, 'Oh, girl, please allow me to do this right now. Can you lead me through it and help me?'"

But her interaction with this man did not end there. She eventually led him to Christ, sharing another piece of Scripture with him: [Romans 10:9](#).

"And so he said the Sinner's [Prayer](#). He confessed with his mouth, and he believed, and he was saved in an instant," Nix said.

"Just in an instant, just in a moment, this man spent his whole life feeling depleted, feeling depressed, feeling like there was nothing that he could cling to. He was changed, and he had a hope. He had a security and he was saved," Nix added as her eyes started to well up with tears.

After Nix finished recounting this powerful interaction, a situation in which a man came to know and accept Christ as his savior, she then asked those watching her video a series of extremely important questions.

"Have you been like this man?" she asked. "Have you been walking just through life day by day, not knowing what really happens at the end when we go?"

"You've felt like there's been a whole list of steps and rules that you have to follow to be a child of God?" said Nix. "I tell you today, friend, that if you confess your sins and you believe that [Jesus](#) Christ died for you and rose again, you too can be saved."

"In fact, I believe if you're seeing this video and you're still watching it," Nix concluded, "he is tugging at you. He is pulling for you. Why don't you come home?"
