2. One of the things that we see in Jesus is a majesty combined with meekness. What other virtues or attributes does Jesus combine in himself that don't often go together?
3. Before today, what were your thoughts about the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist? What were some of your big takeaways from today's message?
4. When it comes to thinking of God as a Father and yourself as a son or daughter of God, what challenges do you have?
5. How does viewing God as a Father change the way you relate with Him? What difficulties do you think some might face in relating to God this way?
6. Pastor Wes mentioned three shifts in thinking that come with seeing God as a Father and yourself as His child. Which ones stood out most to you?
7. Seeing God as Father changes the degree to which you're bothered by other people's opinions. Being a child of God carries with it great privilege. How does being a child of God help you in dealing with criticism and other people's opinions of you?
8. As a child, we also have a greater level of access to God. Do your prayers characterize this access? How should this greater access to God affect our prayers?
9. As a child, we are completely secure in the love of God our Father. Do you struggle with security in your salvation? How would viewing God as Father help this?
10. The power for experiencing our sonship comes from the Holy Spirit. Pastor Wes mentioned pathways for walking in that power. What do you do to ensure your lifestyle doesn't quench the power of the Holy Spirit in your life?
