- 7. How does Jesus' interaction with Hagar foreshadow His treatment of the outcast and the marginalized in the New Testament?
- 8. The sermon states, "Jesus is the only person who is ever always good to ALL." How does this truth impact your view of Jesus and your relationship with Him?
- 9. What is the main difference between Ishmael's lineage and Isaac's? How does this difference challenge/encourage you?
- 10. How can we ensure that we look beyond God's blessings to their ultimate source/fulfillment in Jesus?

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
