This Christmas season ends with Epiphany, a day in which the early church celebrated Jesus' brilliant manifestation (epiphaneia in Greek, also translated as "appearing") not only to the Magi but also to the world through his birth, baptism, and the first recorded miracle at the wedding at Cana. Eastern Christianity maintains this multifaceted celebration of Epiphany, while we in the West focus primarily on remembering and celebrating the arrival of the Magi, those mysterious and devoted Wise Men who traveled far to welcome the Christ and offer their gifts.

As we travel toward Epiphany and savor the final days of Christmas, this is a good time to ponder where we are in our journey. As we cross into the coming year, where do you find yourself on the path? Have you been traveling more by intention or by reacting to what's come your way? What direction do you feel drawn to go in during the coming weeks and months? Is there anything you need to let go of...or to find...in order to take the next step? In the coming months, what gift do you most need to offer, that only you can give?

This Sunday in worship, we will be drawing our new star words on Epiphany. The premise is this: the magi followed the star to find baby Jesus, bringing their gifts. We are also seeking Jesus, trusting God can/does use many signs (or stars) to guide us closer to the Divine presence. (We've included a star in your envelope if you receive this by mail.) I ask that you trust the word that selects you and let it speak to you. A word that may seem unclear on Sunday may gain new meaning as the year goes on.
