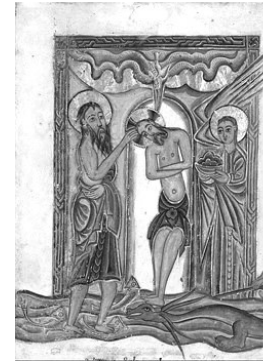

## SERMON MUSINGS

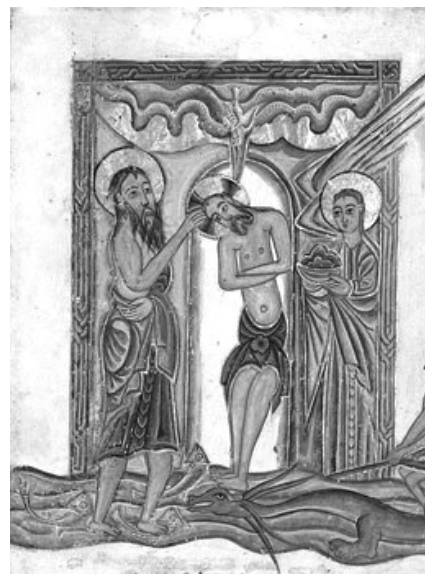
Isaiah 43:1-7, Psalm 29, Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

The waters call out to us in the texts, both as a site of chaos and turmoil, but more importantly, as a site of Divine companionship and restoration. Amidst great waters, we are sometimes awakened to our smallness. We confront the depth of our insignificance as the waters threaten to thrash or drown us. Instead, we're met by our Help, sovereign even over the waters, joining us as we're immersed, lifting us children of The Holy from its depths that we might know healing.

Beloved, the voice from heaven had proclaimed as the baptismal waters of the Jordan rolled off Jesus' body. Beloved, the voice named him as he prepared to begin his public ministry. Beloved, spoken with such power that it would permeate Jesus' entire life and teaching. Beloved, he would name those he met who were desperate for healing, for inclusion, for hope. Beloved, echoing through the ages, continuing to name those drenched in the waters of baptism. Beloved. Child of God.

In the sacrament of baptism and as members of the body of Christ, we, too, are named as beloved children of God. How will we live in such a way that others will know themselves as named by God, beloved by God...especially those who have been given cause to think they are less than loved, less than children of the One who created them?
