



#### SERMON MUSINGS

Jeremiah 1:4-10 & Luke 4:21-30

Jeremiah described God's call for him to prophesy when he was only a boy. God told Jeremiah that God knew him from the time he was conceived to be a prophet to the nations. Jeremiah, similar to Moses, told God he didn't know how to speak. Jeremiah was still young. God, however, told Jeremiah not to be afraid, not to say he was just a boy...he was God's prophet.

In the Gospel lesson Jesus came out of the wilderness and began his preaching ministry in his hometown of Nazareth, where he read from the scroll of Isaiah and declared that day the scripture was fulfilled in their hearing. The Isaiah scroll stated that the Spirit of the Lord was upon the prophet, to bring good news to the poor, bind up the broken-hearted, release to the prisoners, and other good news to all who are marginalized.

At first, Jesus' neighbors in his hometown liked what he said. However, when Jesus responded that no prophet is truly accepted in their hometown, and how Elijah and Elisha were sent to foreigners instead of the people of Israel during difficult times, Jesus' neighbors grew angry and wanted to throw him off a cliff. Apparently, they

didn't like the message
that the good news wasn't
necessarily for them, but
for others. They wanted
to hear words of comfort,
not challenge. They
wanted to hear that the
good news was for
themselves, but not
necessarily that the good
news is for other people,
too.
