#### RESPONDING TO GOD'S GRACE

Service of Installation

Pastor: There are different gifts.

People: But it is the same Spirit who gives them.

Pastor: There are different ways of serving God. People: But it is the same Lord who is served.

Pastor: God works through different people in different ways.

People: But it is the same God who achieves God's purpose through them all.

Pastor: Each gift is given by the Spirit.

Pastor: Though we have different gifts, together we are a ministry of reconciliation led by the risen Christ. Within our common ministry, some members are chosen for particular work as teaching elder, ruling elder, or deacon. In ordination, we recognize these special ministries remembering that our Lord Jesus said, "Whoever among you wants to be great must become the servant of all, and if that one wants to be first among you, that person must be the servant of all."

People: Just as the Son of God came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to set others free.

#### To Elder Morton:

Will you be governed by our Church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination and love?

Will you be a faithful elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nature, and service?

Will you share in government and discipline, serving in governing bodies of the Church, and in your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

#### \*To the Congregation (Please stand)

Elder: Do we the members of the church accept Marsha, who has been ordained and installed as an elder, chosen by God through the voice of the congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

People: We do.

Elder: Do we agree to encourage her, to respect her decisions, and to follow as she guides us, serving Jesus Christ who alone is the head of the church?

People: We do.

[Ordained Teaching and Ruling Elders are invited to come forward and participate in the laying on of hands during the prayer.]

Pastor: Almighty God, in every age you have chosen servants to speak your word and lead your loyal people. We thank you for these women and men whom you have called to serve you. Set them apart, these servants, for the work to which you have called them. Give them wisdom, faith, and courage for the leadership tasks for which you have inspired them. May they lead this congregation to faithful service. May they be filled with the Holy spirit and be faithful disciples as long as they live through Jesus Christ. Amen.

People: God of Grace, who called us to a common ministry as ambassadors of Christ, trusting us with the message of reconciliation, give us courage and discipline to follow where your servants rightly lead us; that together we may declare your wonderful deeds and show your love to the world, through Jesus Christ the Lord of all. Amen.



#### **SERMON MUSINGS**

Luke 9:28-43

The challenges that the disciples encounter in this passage from Luke are like some of my own challenges. Like Peter, John, and James at prayer with Jesus on the mountain, I sometimes struggle to stay awake when it's easier to be lulled into sleep and to miss the thin places, the meetings of heaven and earth, that open up in the midst of daily life. And when those thin places come... when a burst of inspiration opens a new world, say, or,



after hours or months, something finally comes together and finds me transformed... well, it can be tempting to want to set up shop there, to preserve the moment, as Peter longed to do. I recognize his impulse in myself, his desire to want to linger in the wonder. And why shouldn't he? Yet the persistent invitation of Jesus is to take what we have seen, what we have found, down into the trenches of everyday life.

It's not a new message; I bet that the greater percentage of the sermons preached on this text will offer a variation on the theme of navigating the transition from the mountaintop to the flatlands. And yet we need to keep practicing that transition, to keep rehearsing the journey that moves us from being recipients of wonder to becoming people who, transformed and—shall we say it transfigured by what we have received, can then offer these wonders to a broken world.

When the disciples come down from the mountain, they still have plenty of struggles ahead. They've hardly gotten their feet back on flat land when, Luke tells us, they encounter, and fail to heal, a boy in the grip of what Luke describes as an unclean spirit.

This is a great passage to lead us toward Lent, a season that is all about discerning what it is that we cling to, and what we need to practice letting go of in order for Christ to become clearer in us.

In the meantime, where does the story of Peter, John and James connect with your own?

Have a good end-of-Epiphany in these most holy days of blessed light! Pastor Sheri

## VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY WITH THE NORTHGLENN WINTER HOUSING PROGRAM - Meals for Shelter Guests

The Good Shepherd community has three opportunities to help our siblings in Christ who shelter at the Northglenn Winter Shelter.

- 1. Items needed for adult men and women (25 guests are housed). If you are interested in contributing any of these items, please bring them to the church and place them in basket in the narthex or in the basket on the fellowship hall table near the kitchen.
  - Toiletries (travel size): shampoo, conditioner, body wash, hand lotion, toothpaste, toothbrush, floss, combs, deodorant, emery boards, nail clippers, razors, Q-tips
  - Sleep masks, ear plugs or ear buds to listen to music
  - · Warm gear: scarves, beanies, gloves, hand warmers
  - Socks, underwear, and thermals
  - Paper products: paper plates, plastic utensils, water cups, coffee cups, napkins, brown bag lunch sacks, aluminum foil, Ziplock bags
  - Food that DOES NOT need refrigeration or cooking: coffee, sugar packets, creamer, bagels, muffins, fruit cups, individually wrapped healthy snack items (these can go in breakfast bags)
- 2. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Opportunity is to join Pastor Sheri in providing breakfast bags to go on Tuesday, March 1.

We need breakfast to-go bags for 15 people filled with things like:

- granola bars or protein breakfast bars
- oatmeal cups
- mini muffins store-bought or homemade.
- fruit cups or fruit leather
- squeezable applesauce or yogurt.
- packaged baked goods, cinnamon rolls, donuts, etc.
- · drinks juice box, chocolate milk, etc.

Please bring to the church and place in marked baskets.

3. On Monday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, help prepare and serve dinner to 12-15 guests from 6:30pm-8:00pm. Please let Pastor Sheri know if you are interested in serving with her. We will plan the menu and the serving plan together.
