SERMON MUSINGS

Jeremiah 17:5-10 and Luke 6:17-26



As I was planning the hymns to go with today's scripture readings, I came across *Change my Heart, O God.* The words include, "You are the potter. I am the clay. Mold me and make me. This is what I pray."

I took ceramics in high school and for three semesters in college, so the potter is a metaphor that resonates with me.

We're not talking about modeling clay here. We're talking about a form of mud that is dug out of river banks, cleaned of debris, and used by potters and sculptors. The water in the clay keeps it soft and flexible. Once it dries, it becomes brittle and fragile until it's fired, driving the chemically bound water out of it. Then it can be coated with glaze, which a liquid suspension of glass particles that melt into a coating over the clay during a second firing.

To work clay properly, it must be kneaded like bread before it's used to remove any lumps or air bubbles. On a potter's wheel, one applies pressure to the outside of the lump to make it tall and thinner, then to the top to flatten it out. This is done three times before the center is opened and the pot is formed. The pressure aligns the molecules in the clay to make it stronger and easier to work. Water allows the potter's hands to slide over the clay and shape it without distorting it.

Today's readings are about how trees grow their roots deeply to the source of water by the stream, like us when we reach for God's baptismal water in the form of the Holy Spirit. Jesus says we're blessed when we endure hardships for his sake. The potter is applying the right pressure at the right time to make us stronger, lubricated with the water of love. Life isn't easy, but God can use our trials to make us sturdy and beautiful. We just have to yield to the touch of the Master's hand.
