## 1. Intro

- Genesis 1-12 is the foundation for the rest of Scripture.
- Noah, the ark, and the flood is the account of unrestrained sin in the human race and God's judgment on it. But it's also the story of a blameless man named Noah, who God rescued from His judgment because of his faith.

## 2. Text Genesis 6-9

## Genesis 6:1-7

- Everything that humans thought or imagined was consistently and totally evil.
  - How long after creation did the flood occur? **1,656** years.

#### **Genesis 6:8-22**

- Noah found <u>favor</u> with the Lord. He was <u>righteous</u> and <u>blameless</u> and walked in close fellowship with God.
  - Noah honored God and lived differently than every other person on planet earth!
- God's rescue plan for Noah involved building an ark.
  - Was it actually possible to fit all the animals on the ark Noah built? The "Answers in Genesis" organization gives insight on that:
    - There were possibly around 6,700 "kinds" of animals on the ark.
    - Obviously, there were no sea creatures on board.
    - God sent young, small elephants, dinosaurs, etc. rather than large adults.
    - Perhaps God put the animals in a state of hibernation so that they wouldn't need much food while on the ark.
- Why did Noah find favor with God? Why did God call him righteous? His faith.
  - Hebrews 11:7 "It was by faith that Noah built a large boat to save his family from the flood. He obeyed God, who warned him about things that had never happened before. By his faith Noah condemned the rest of the world, and he received the righteousness that comes by faith."

#### **Genesis 7:1-24**

- Noah's family and the animals who entered the ark were <u>saved</u> from God's judgment.
- The Lord closed the door behind them. (Gen 7:16)
  - The story of Noah, the ark, and the flood was a literal, true story, but it was also a picture of salvation through Christ alone.
- The flood was **global** and the water covered the highest mountain on earth. (7:19)
  - Psalm 104:5-9 "You placed the world on its foundation so it would never be moved. 6 You clothed the earth with floods of water, water that covered even the mountains. 7 At your command, the water fled; at the sound of your thunder, it hurried away. 8 Mountains rose and valleys sank to the levels you decreed. 9 Then you set a firm boundary for the seas, so they would never again cover the earth."
  - All land animals died. (Genesis 7:19-24)
- Genesis 8: the flood waters receded. Noah's family and the animals left the ark.
  - Noah was on the ark for around **370** days.
- Genesis 9: The <u>rainbow</u> is the sign of God's promise to all mankind that He will never again destroy the earth with water.
  - Genesis 9:12-17

# 3. Application:

God's Word predicts there is another catastrophic judgment coming: **2 Peter 3:3-13** 

- If you've entered the door of salvation through faith alone in Jesus, thank God you
  are safe from the coming judgment! -John 10:9
- If you haven't entered the door of salvation through faith in Jesus alone, do it today.
- Lastly, do we have the same compassion for unbelievers that God has? Are we burdened for them and unwilling that they be destroyed in the next judgment? What are we doing about that?
