1. Intro

 We start the book of Luke today, and our next 5 sermons will surround the real story of Christmas, the Biblical version!

2. Text: Luke 1:1-25

Luke 1:1-4

- Luke carefully investigated <u>eyewitness</u> reports surrounding the life of Jesus and wrote an accurate account of them so that Theophilus could know the <u>truth</u>.
 - Luke wrote this account around AD 60 and it covered events surrounding Jesus from roughly 4 BC to AD 30.

Luke 1:5-17

 Despite being relatively unknown, childless, and <u>disregarded</u> by the culture, Zechariah and Elizabeth remained <u>faithful</u> to the Lord; and the Lord supernaturally caused them to be pregnant with a son named John who would <u>prepare</u> people for the coming of the Lord Jesus.

Luke 1:18-25

- Zechariah did not <u>believe</u> God's message through Gabriel, so God caused him to be unable to <u>speak</u> until his son, John, was born.
 - It was not his questioning that was wrong, it was his unbelief in God's Word.
 - It's a big deal to God that people **believe** what He says.

3. Application

- Are we believing with childlike faith God's messages to us in His Word?
- Zechariah and Elizabeth lived many years with an unfulfilled hope and dream as well as with a stained image in their culture, yet they loved the Lord wholeheartedly, and they faithfully followed Him year after year. Are we handling our unfulfilled hopes and/or tarnished image the same way?
