Noah: Grace Notes
(Genesis 11:1-9)

No matter where you've been, what you've done, or what's been done to you, you are valued and loved. Over and over, we see in Scripture the pattern of the kind of person God will use mightily. Not a perfect person. Not by any stretch, as we will see with Noah. But one whose heart leans toward God, who walks daily with Him, who hears His voice and follows his lead. Let's take a look at his story through our eyes as adults and find the grace notes that can teach us still today.

- 3. Have you seen people do what they believe God wants in order to get him to do what they want? How might Christians move past this trap as we work to grow in our faith?
- 4. Read Luke 9:23-26 and John 16:33. How might these scriptures help you to understand who God is? What are some small ways we might live the truth of these scriptures every day?
- 5. Name two things you are grateful for right now. How do you believe each one draws you closer to God?

- b. This week, how might you express your thanks to God for who He is?
