



Things Jesus Never Said
WEEK 1: “I’m so disappointed in you.”
(Psalm 139:1-16 NIV)

Imagine with me for a minute if you got an email saying that you had an appointment scheduled for you with Jesus. One hour, in person, just the two of you. What do you think He would say to you? Many people think Jesus would talk about how disappointed He is with them, but is this really something Jesus would say?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. [ICEBREAKER] Are you disappointed in anything or anyone this week? Why?
2. If disappointment is defined as missed expectations, what missed expectations do you have related to church and religion?
3. What do you imagine someone who feels they’ve disappointed Jesus would have as a soundtrack?
4. Read Romans 8:1-2 and John 3:17-18. What speaks to you in these verses?
5. What are your thoughts on what Pastor Will Davis’s said, “If someone knows everything, how can we disappoint Him? How can you let down someone who always has the right expectations and understanding in every situation?”
6. If someone could change their soundtrack to one that knows it’s not possible for Jesus to be disappointed in them, how might that affect their life and choices? How might it be possible to help others understand this truth?
7. NEXT STEPS: This week consider taking some time to think about the below and your next steps.
 - a. Are you holding onto anything that is causing you to feel you are disappointing Jesus?
 - b. What have you learned that might help you to remind yourself Jesus is NOT disappointed in you?
 - c. How might you help others in this area?
