Noah: Grace Notes
(Genesis 9:1-17; 1 John 1:9 NIV)

No matter where you've been, what you've done, or what's been done to you, you are valued and loved. Over and over, we see in Scripture the pattern of the kind of person God will use mightily. Not a perfect person. Not by any stretch, as we will see with Noah. But one whose heart leans toward God, who walks daily with Him, who hears His voice and follows his lead. Let's take a look at his story through our eyes as adults and find the grace notes that can teach us still today.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. [ICEBREAKER] In one word, what is your best trait?
2. What in your life have you noticed tends to dehumanize you if you don't recharge in Christ?
3. How would you describe a covenant in two or three words for those who are still getting to know Christ?
4. What ways do you use to help you remember dates, appointments, errands, or assignments? Do you use the same methods to remember scripture, sermons, and lessons from church?
5. How can you best remember each day what God intended (Love one another) moving forward? What small ways can you connect this truth with your day-to-day world?

NEXT STEPS: This week consider taking time to think about your next steps in this area.

- a. What do you need to bring to God this week? How can you help others do the same?
- b. How can you best remember "Love one another"? Who needs your love today?
