WEEK 2: “You Missed My Will For Your Life.”
(Acts 16:6-10 NIV)

Imagine with me for a minute if you got an email saying that you had an appointment scheduled for you with Jesus. One hour, in person, just the two of you. What do you think He would say to you? Many people think Jesus would talk about how disappointed He is with them, but is this really something Jesus would say?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. [ICEBREAKER] What was your favorite school subject?
2. Is there anything that can be positive about uncertainty? If uncertainty itself isn't positive for you, what might be a positive result of living through uncertainty?
3. Can you think of a time when you made a wrong turn and what you learned from the experience? Why might the experience of going somewhere you didn't plan to go help you in your relationship with the Lord?
4. Is it even possible to find something when you don't know what it looks like? How do you think this might apply to those seeking a church home, God, or a relationship with Him?
5. Pastor William reminds us that God's will is not a feeling or a formula, but a relationship. What is one thing you feel is vital to a relationship? How might you apply this to your spiritual relationship?

NEXT STEPS: This week consider taking time to think about your next steps in this area.

- a. What's one action you can take to move your relationship with God into first place in your life?
- b. Stay patient, Stay humble, and Keep praying.
