- (3-5) take an _____ / ____ check
 - David claims innocence in specific accusations, but is willing to examined, even having his "glory" (reputation) lay in the dust.

(6-11) take it to _____ and leave it there

- God has appointed a judgment (see Hebrews 9:27-28, Acts 17:30-31, 2 Peter 3:11-12, Revelation 11:17-18 and 19:1-2)
- God is the One Who tests the minds and hearts (see Psalm 26:1-2, 1 Corinthians 4:3-5, Matthew 7:1-2)
- God is the righteous Judge who "feels indignation." We must not avenge ourselves (Romans 12:19-21)
- The only true Innocent One is Jesus, Who models for us entrusting ourselves to God (1 Peter 2:21-23)

(12-16) take heed of the _____ we all face

- We turn to God in repentance OR God comes for us as the Divine Warrior.
- We must look to and repent from all the stages of the life cycle of sin (see James 1:14-15, Mark 7:20-23, Luke 6:43-45)
- God will make sure that ultimately justice is done, but even now He often allows the principle of retributive justice to work (see Proverbs 26:27)
