Disclaimers: JESUS speaks to the Eleven to prepare them for His

death. JOHN writes to present an evangelistic message ("but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (20:31)

JOHN'S quoting of Jesus must be understood in the context of the Eleven, not immediately applied to our situations. JOHN'S stated purpose reminds us that we must first and foremost see what He has included as giving us a reason to believe that Jesus is the Messiah.

When we decide to become Jesus' followers (His disciples), we should not be surprised that . . .
